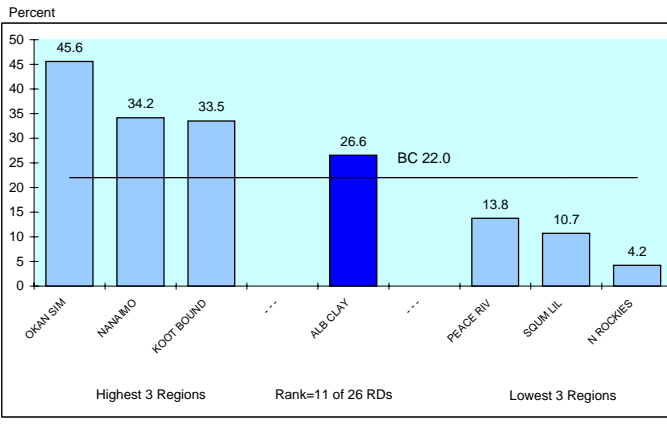

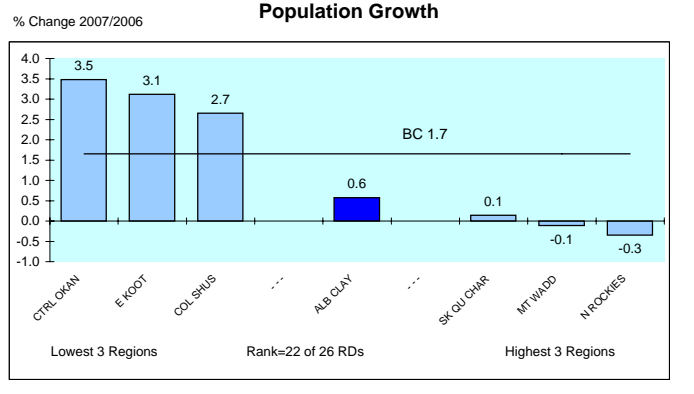

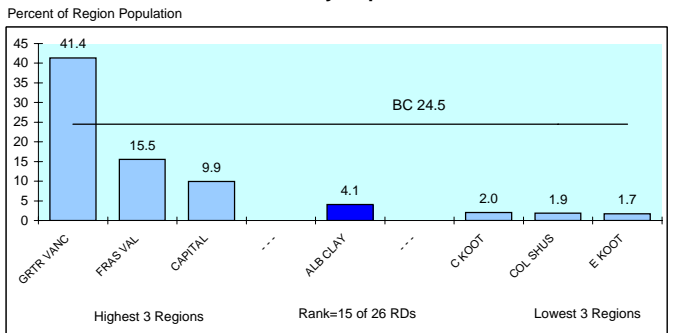

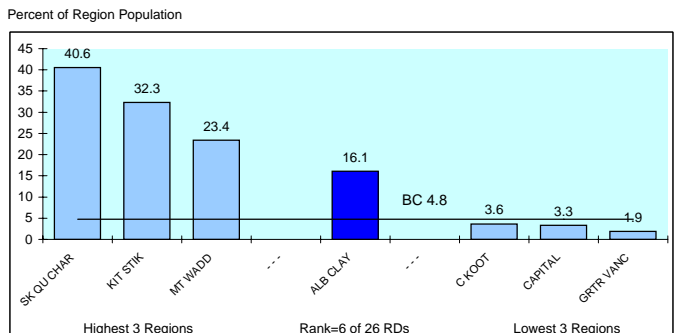

#### Visible Minority Population - 2006



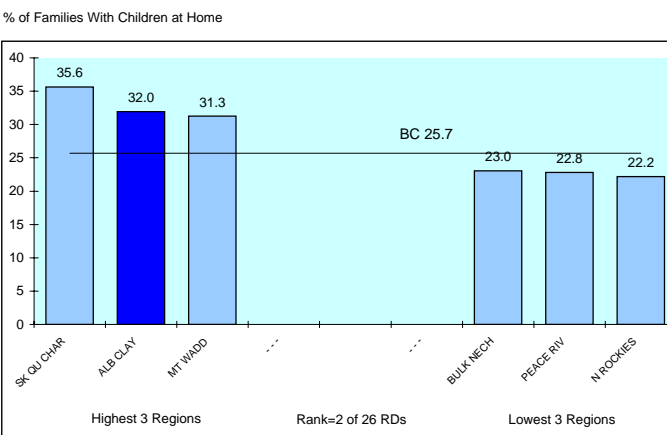
#### Aboriginal Identity - 2006

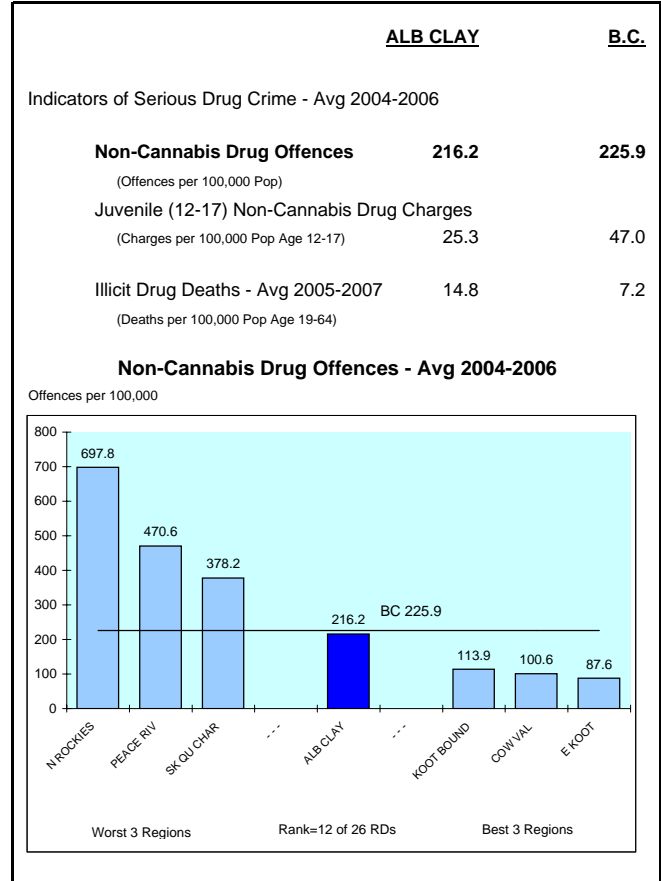

### CHANGE IN CRIME RATE



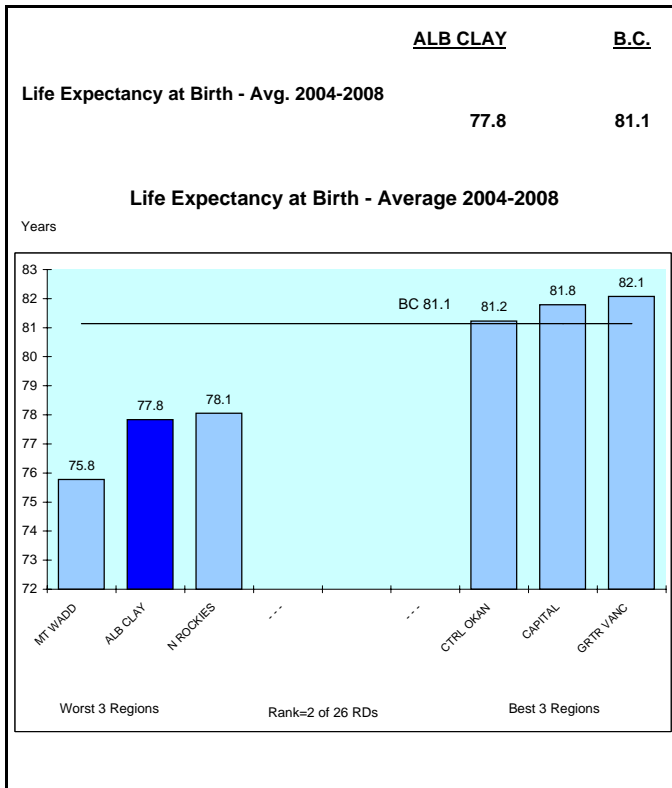

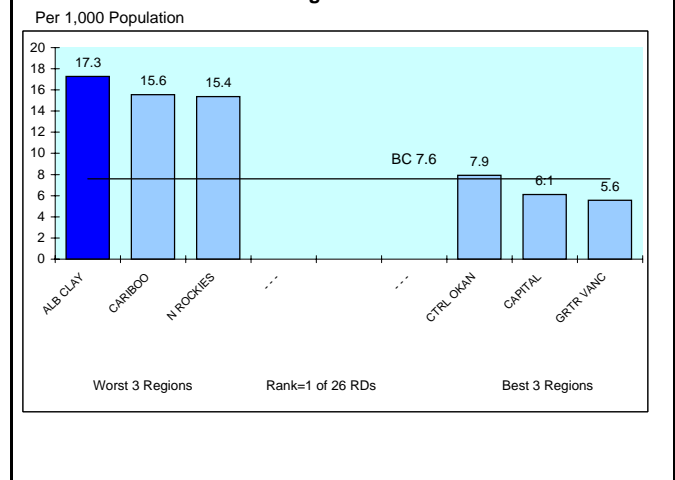

### Potential Years of Life Lost Due to Accidental Causes Average 2003-2007



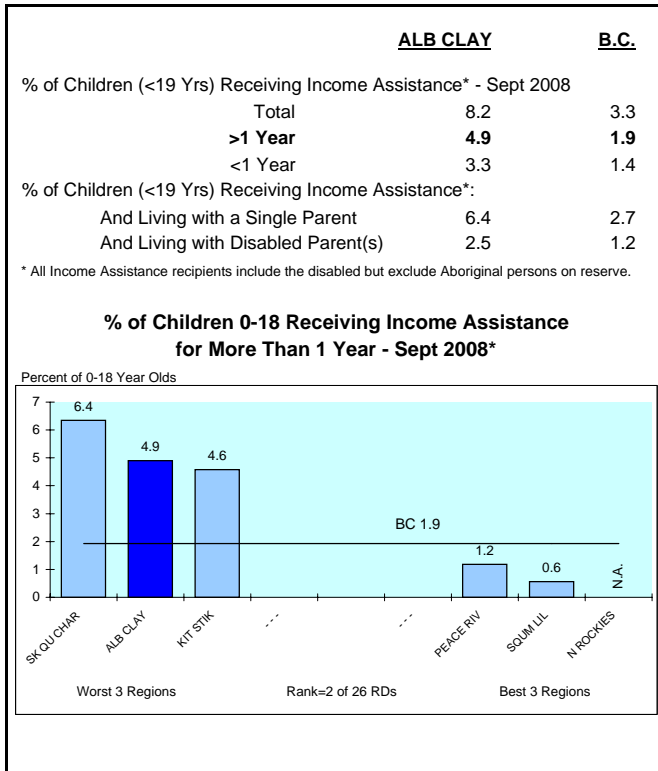

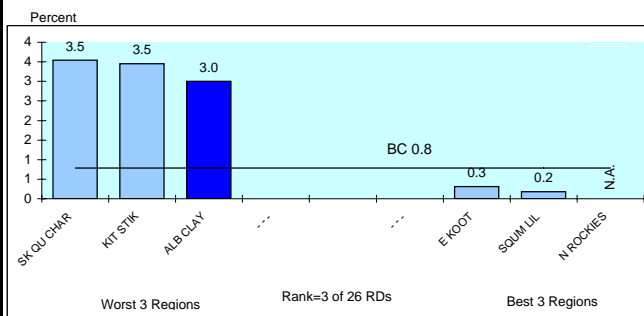

#### % of Youth 19-24 Receiving Income Assistance - September 2008



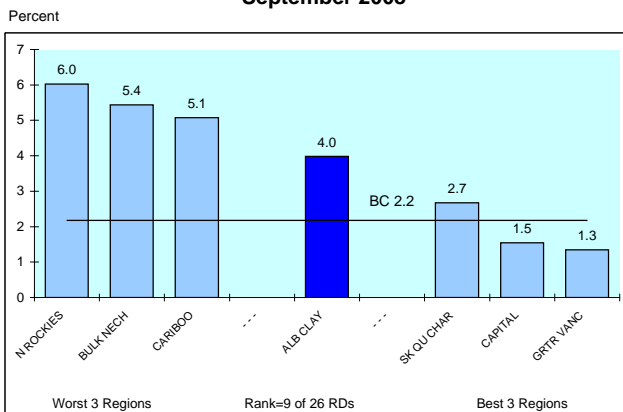
#### % of Youth 19-24 Receiving Income Assistance Who Are Employable

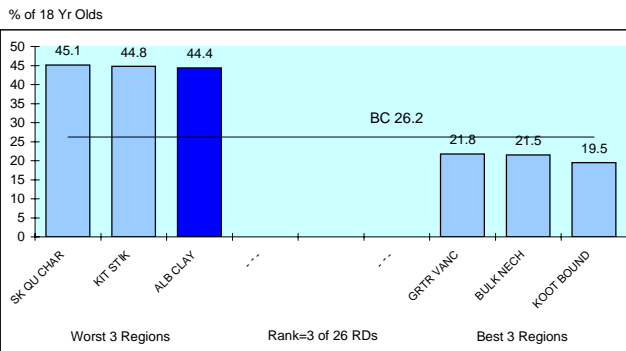

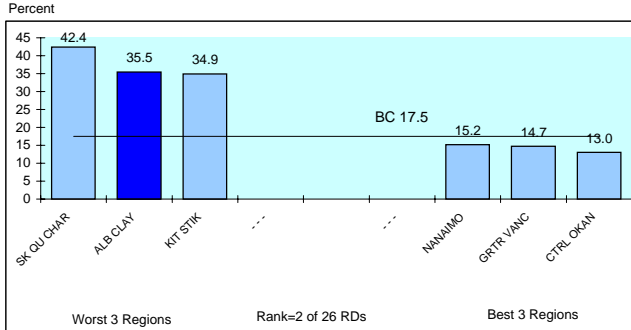
