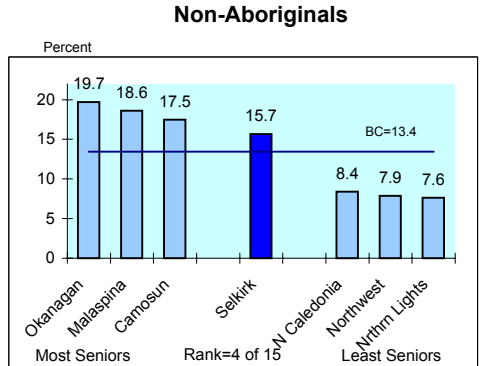
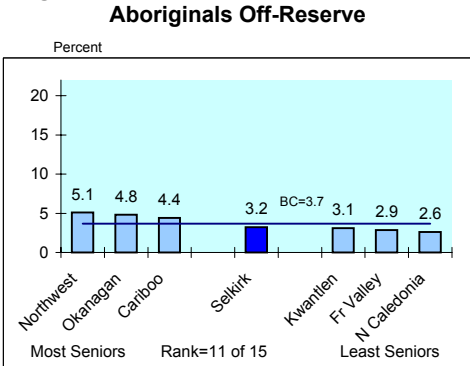
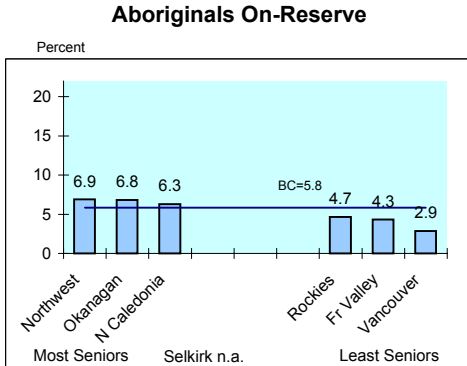
### A RELATIVELY YOUTHFUL POPULATION?

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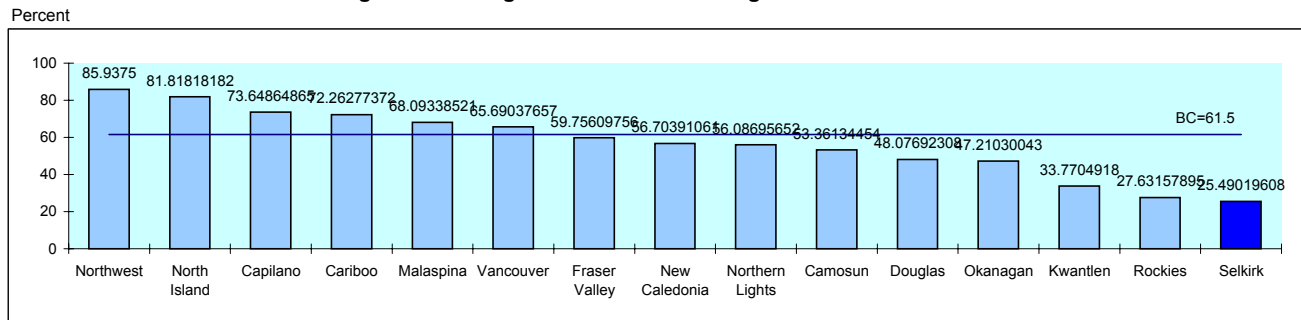

## % of Aboriginal Youth Age 18 to 24 Who are Registered under the Indian Act



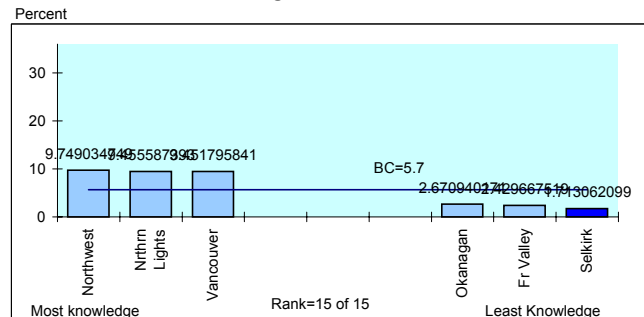
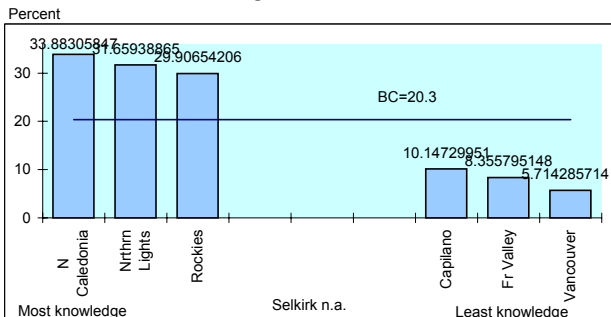

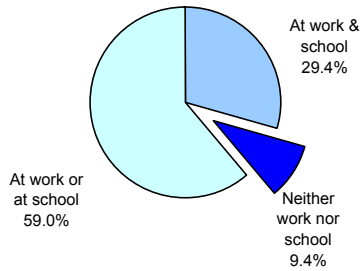

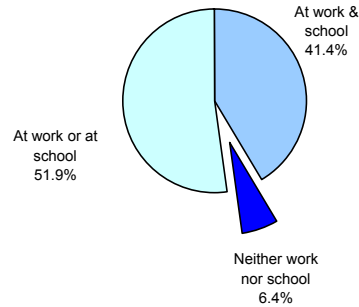
**% of Aboriginal Population Age 15-24 Who Either Worked or Attended School between September 2000 and May 2001**

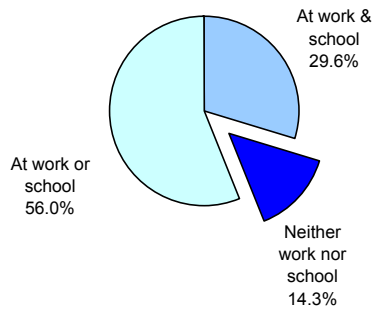

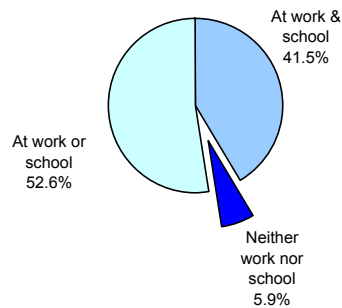

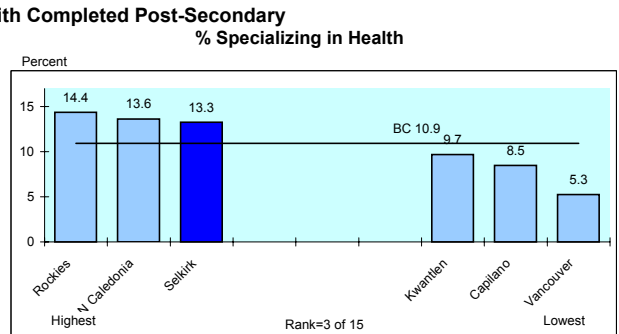
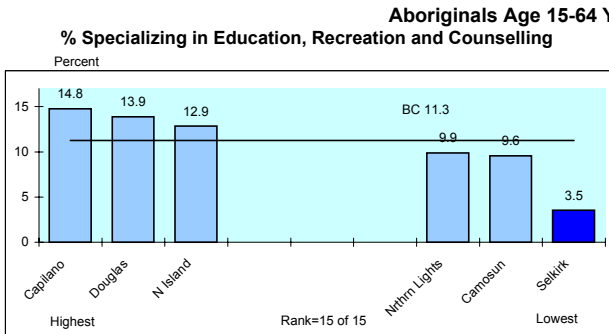
### Labour Force Participation Rates of Aboriginals Age 25-54

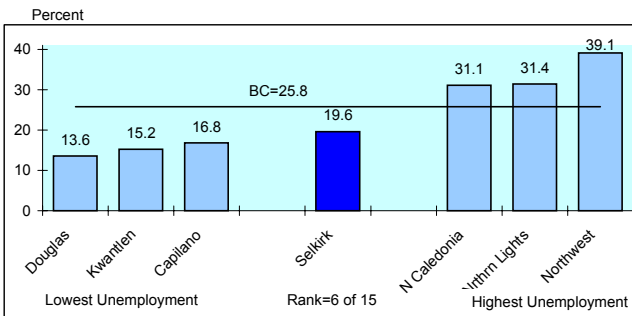

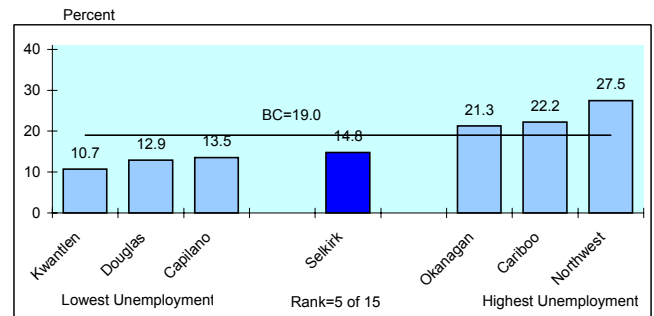

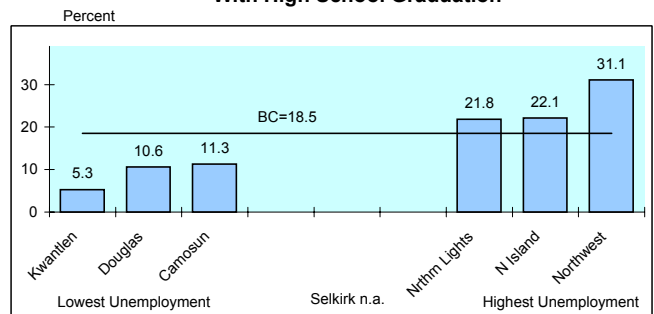

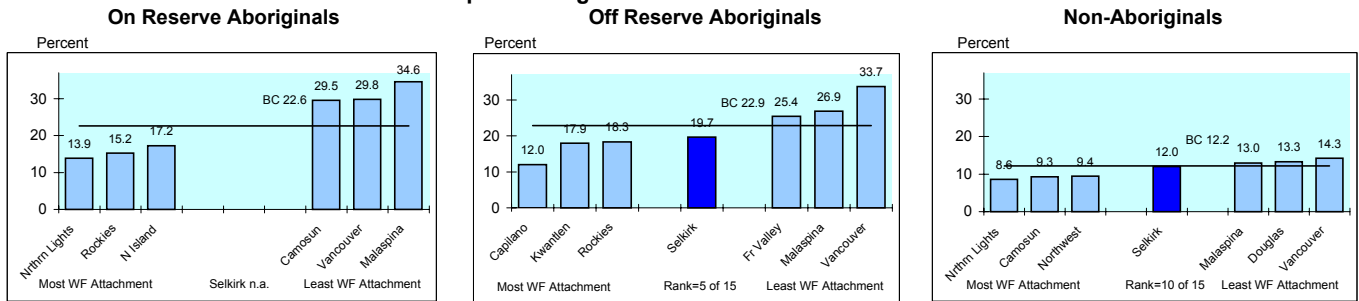

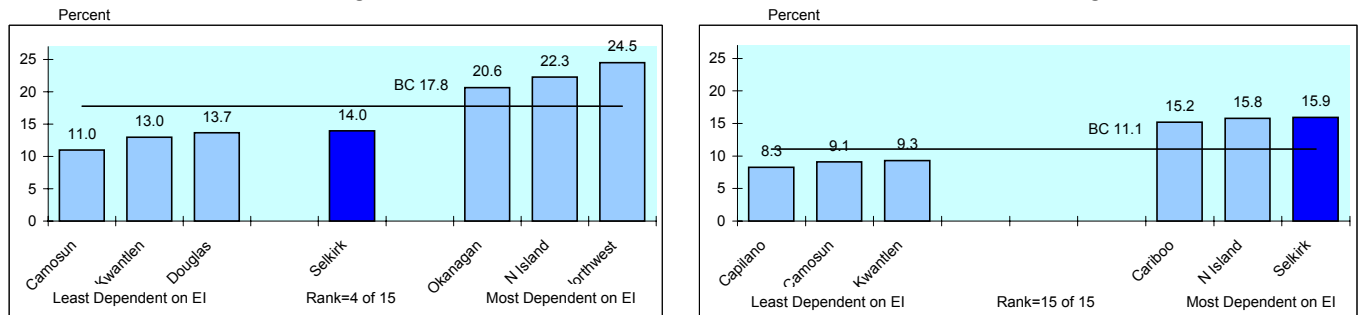
### % of Population Age 25-54 Who Have Not Worked Since 1999

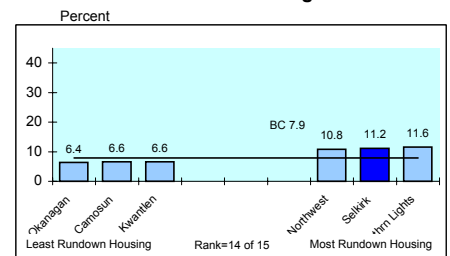
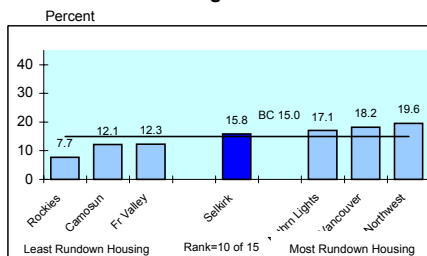
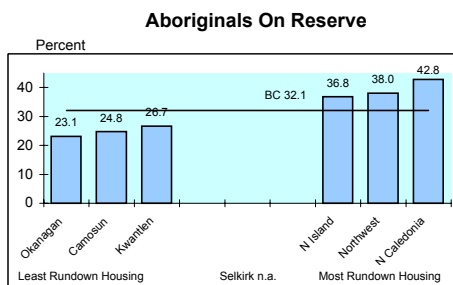
### % of One-Family Households with Children under 15 with Government Transfers as a Major Source of Income
