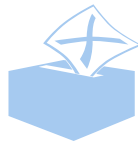

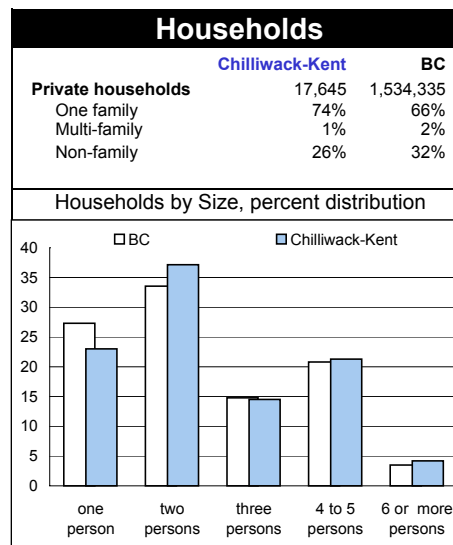
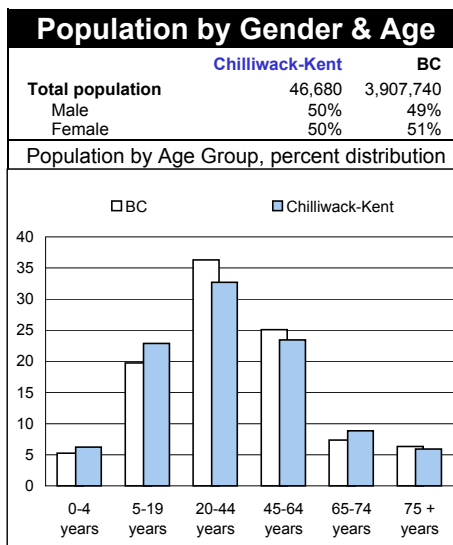

This report is derived by summing data for Dissemination Areas (DA) that constitute the Provincial Electoral District (PED). DAs crossing PED boundaries are allocated to only one PED. Since data for a number of DAs is suppressed and data for all other is randomly rounded to preserve privacy of individuals, the sum of data for all PEDs will not total to BC figures here that have been rounded after first aggregating unsuppressed and unrounded DA data. Medians and standard errors are suppressed.

An exception occurs in the populations reported for the 2001 and 1996 Censuses. Available population counts for 'block face' unit permit a more accurate association with the appropriate PED. However, no further characteristics are available at the block face.

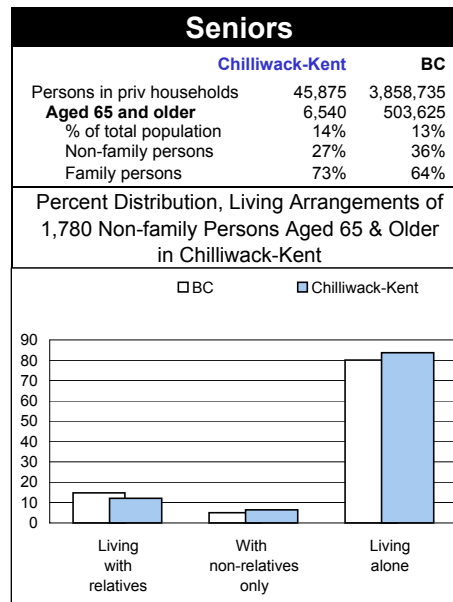
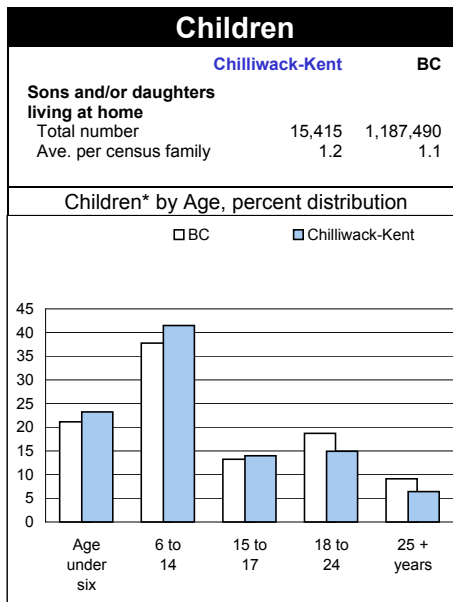

### Notes

**Population** - effective since the 1991 Census, non-permanent residents included in total population.

**1996 Census population** - based on 2001 boundaries.

**Economic family** - refers to two or more persons living in the same dwelling, related to each other by blood, marriage, common-law or adoption.

**Experienced labour force** - includes persons who worked since Jan 1, 2000 and who were employed or unemployed during the reference week.

**Non-movers** - on Census Day were living at the same address as one or five years previous.

**Non-migrant movers** - lived at a different address but in the same census subdivision (CSD).

**Average** - or arithmetic mean is calculated by dividing the sum of included categories by the number of included categories.

**Median** - an alternate measure of 'averageness'. Median income of a specific group is that amount which divides their income size distribution into two halves (below and above the median).

**Incidence of low income** - the percentage of a specific group below Statistics Canada's low income cut-offs (LICO).
