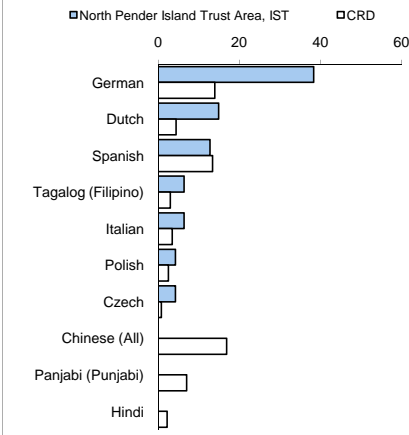
The census is a rich source of demographic data for even small communities, at five year intervals. The information presented here is drawn from a large dataset. Other variables are available by request on a fee for service basis.



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**Non-Official Languages Spoken**

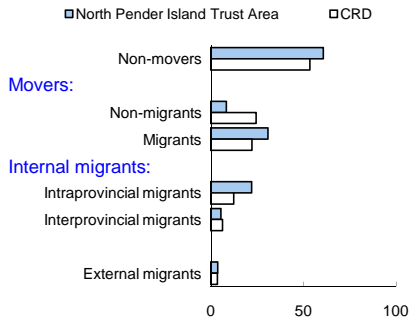

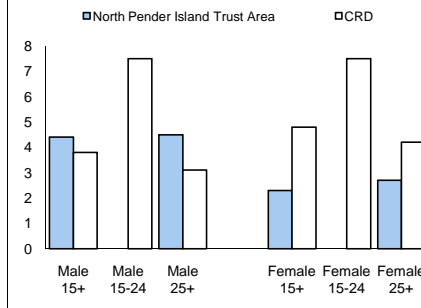
5-Year Mobility of Population 5 Years & Older, % distrib.

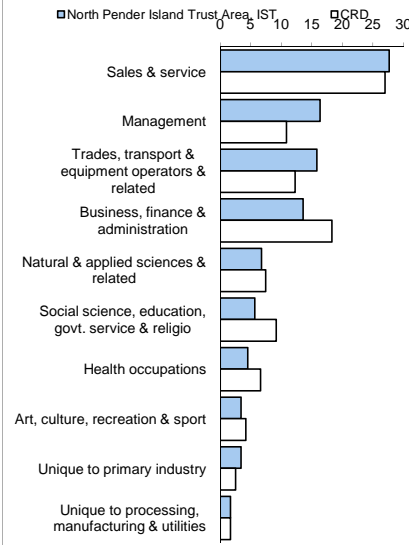

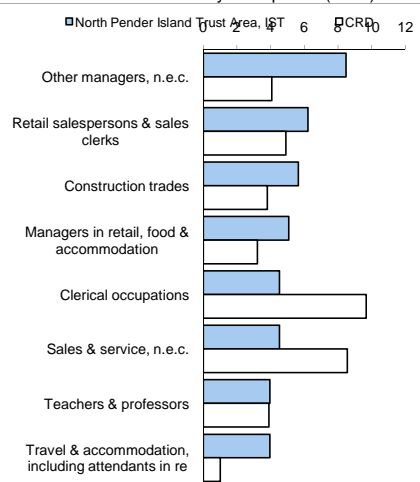
Percent Distribution by Occupation (NOC)

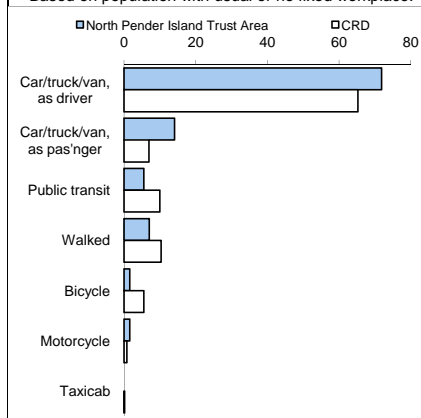

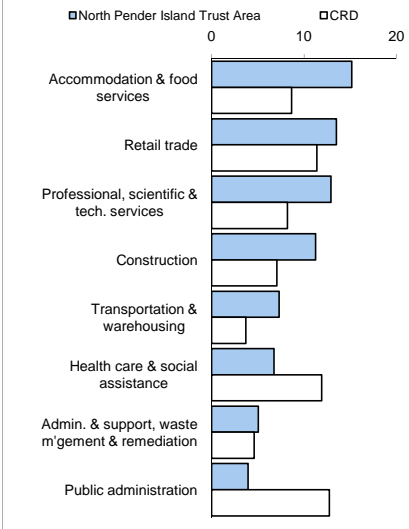

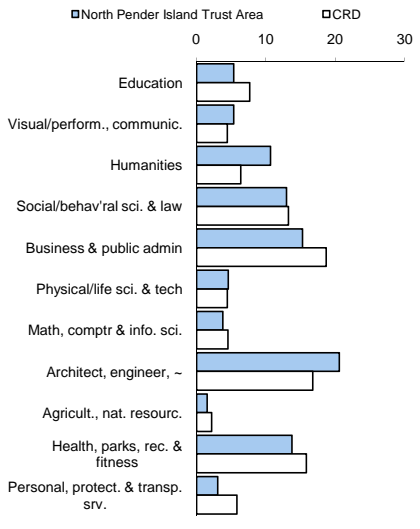
**Top 8 Industries by Labour Force**

Percent Distribution by Industry (NAICS 2002)



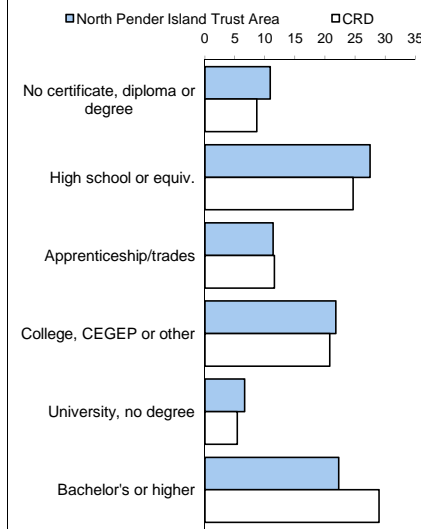
**Education: Field of Study**

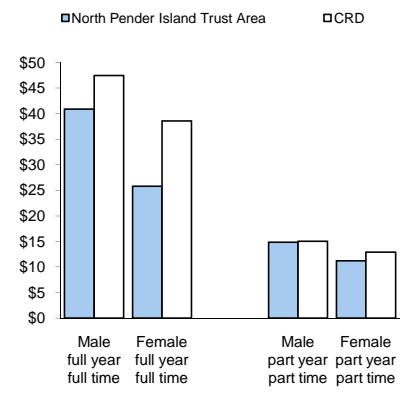

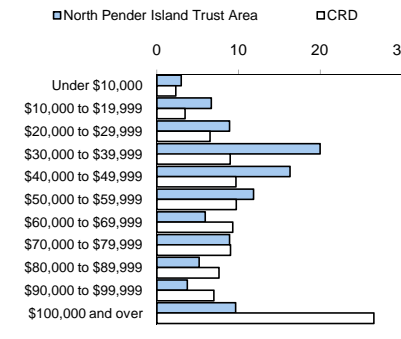

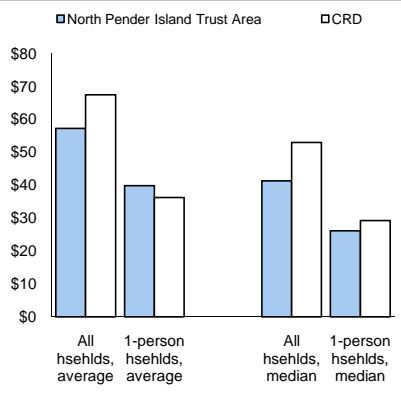

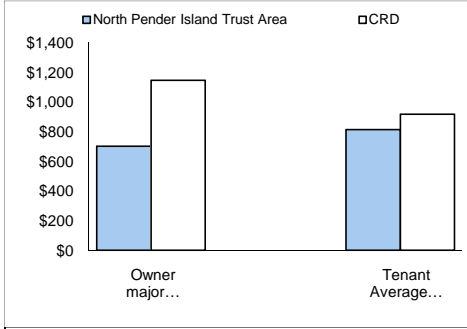
2005 Before-tax Household Income (\$,000)

**Economic family** - refers to two or more persons living in the same dwelling, related to each other by blood, marriage, common-law or adoption.  
**Experienced labour force** - includes persons who worked since Jan 1, 2005 and who were employed or unemployed during the reference week.  
**Non-movers** - on Census Day were living at the same address as one or five years previous.  
**Non-migrant movers** - lived at a different address but in the same census subdivision (CSD).  
**Average** - or arithmetic mean is calculated by dividing the sum of included categories by the number of included categories.  
**Median** - an alternate measure of 'averageness'. Median income of a specific group is that amount which divides their income size distribution into two halves (below and above the median).  
**Prevalence of low income** - the percentage of a specific group below Statistics Canada's low income cut-offs (LICO).
