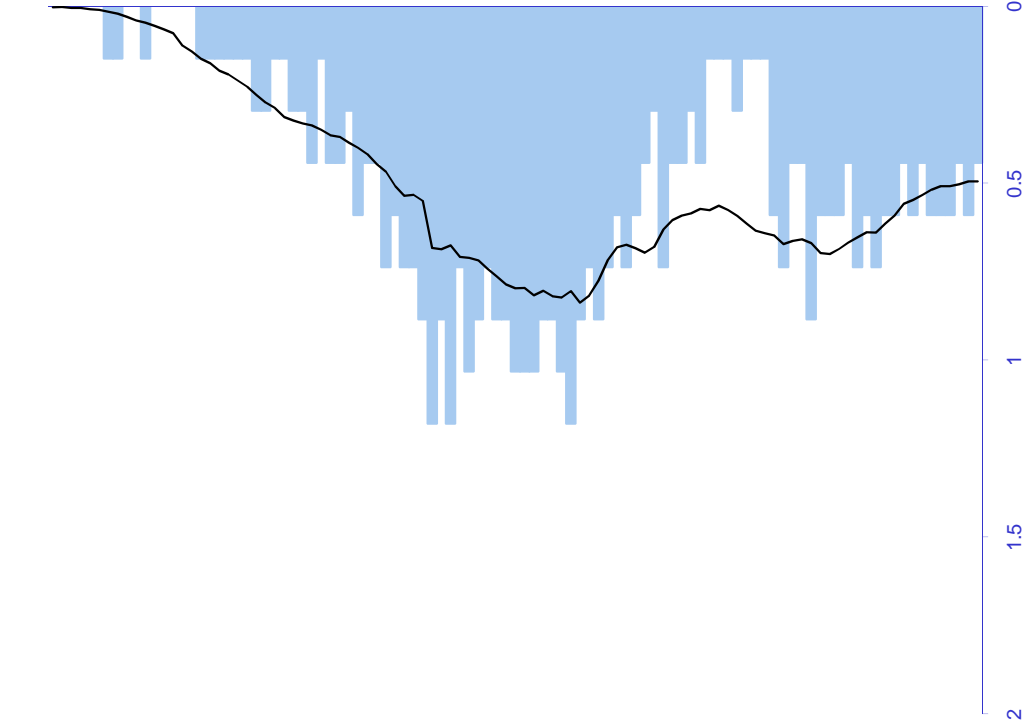

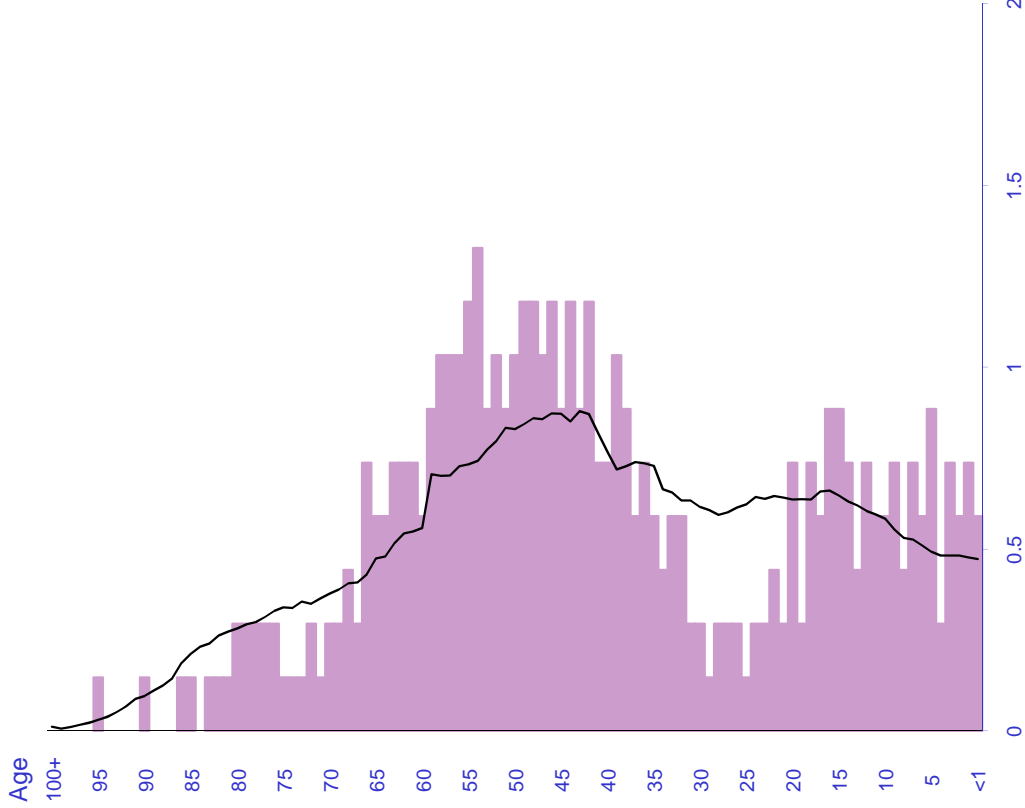

1,615 Males, median age 45.3; (BC median 40.0)



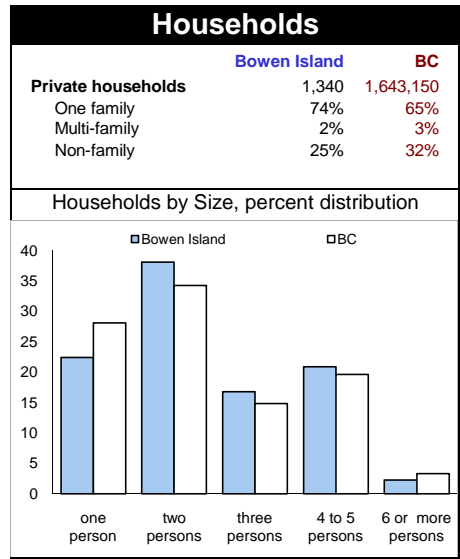
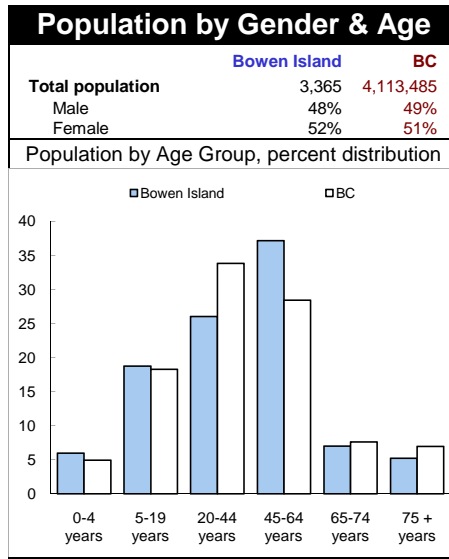

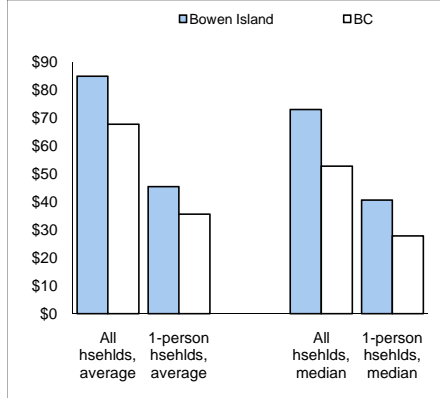

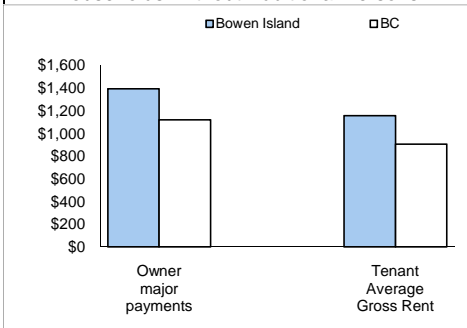
2005 Before-tax Household Income (\$,000)
