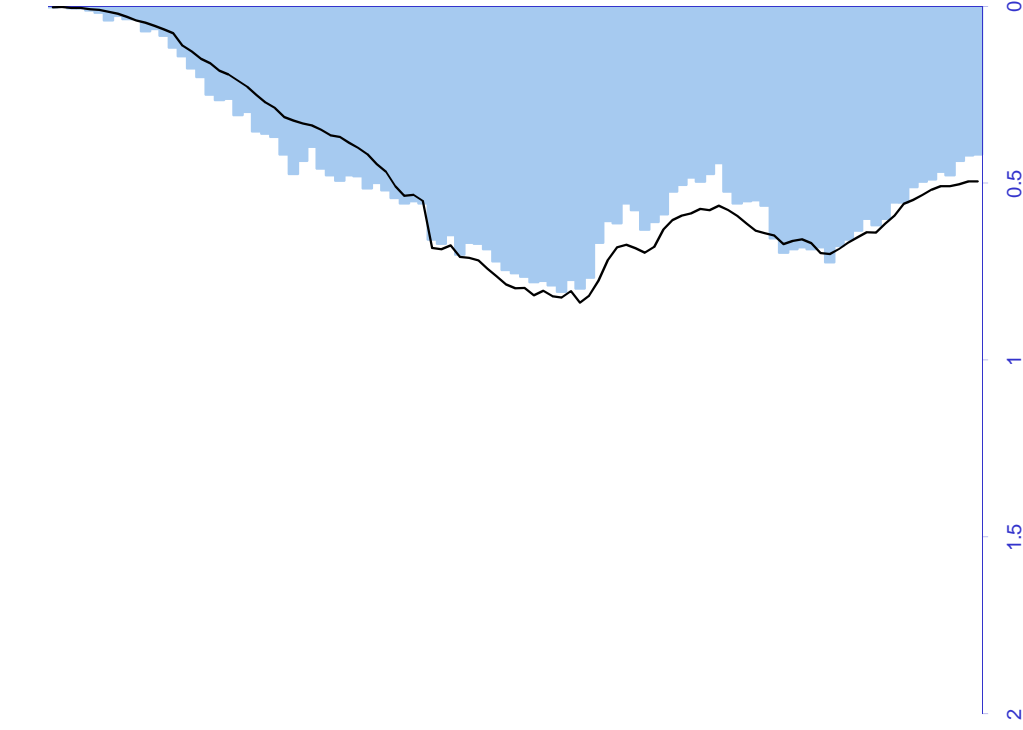

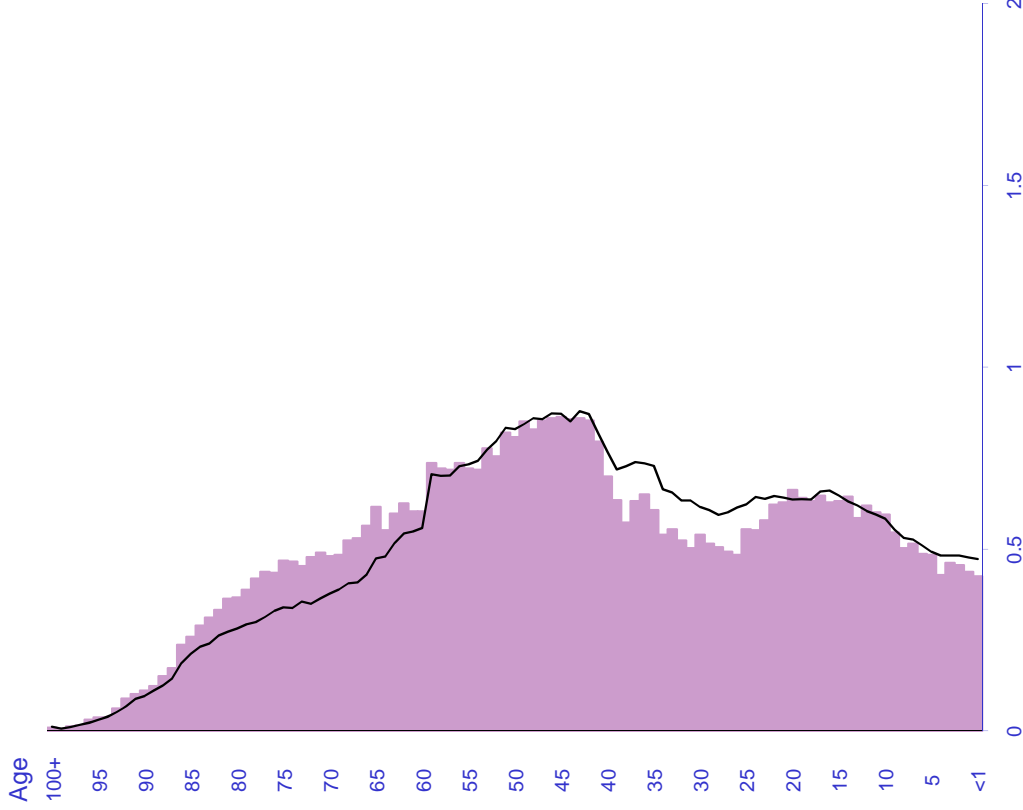

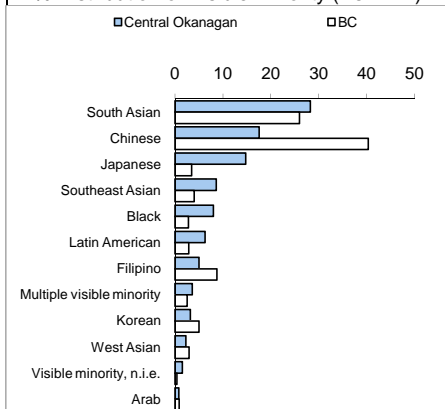

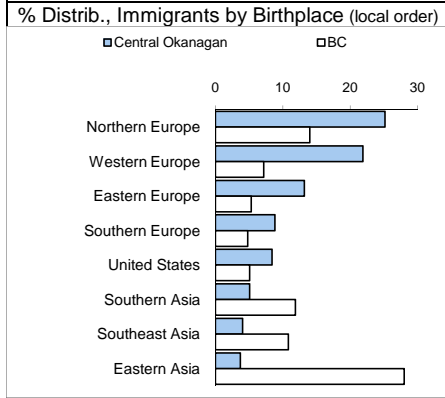

### % Distribution of Visible Minority (vis. min.)



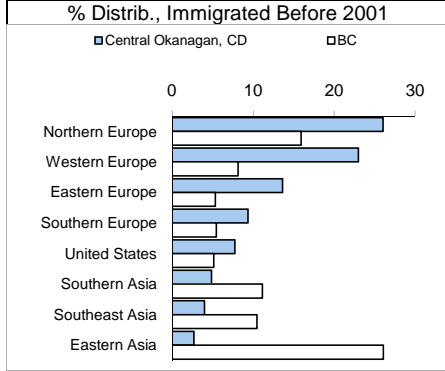

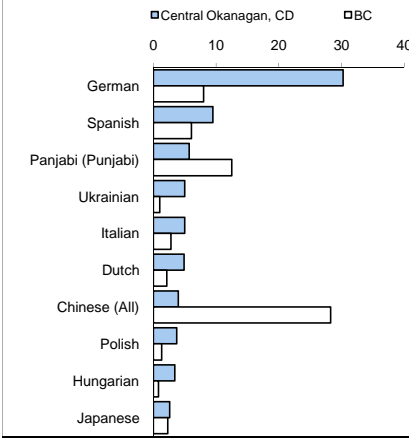

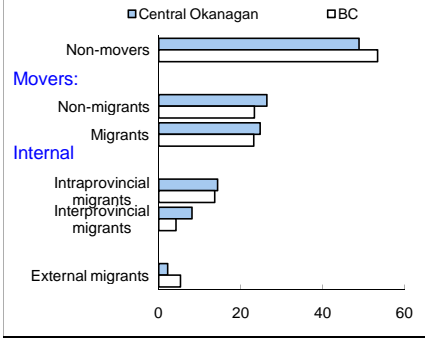

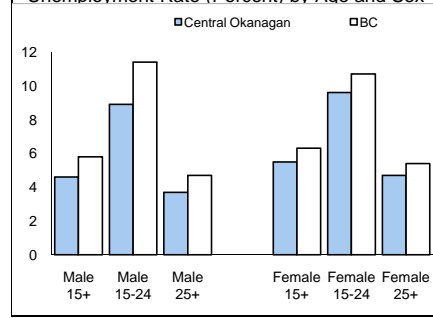
5-Year Mobility of Population 5 Years & Older, % distrib.

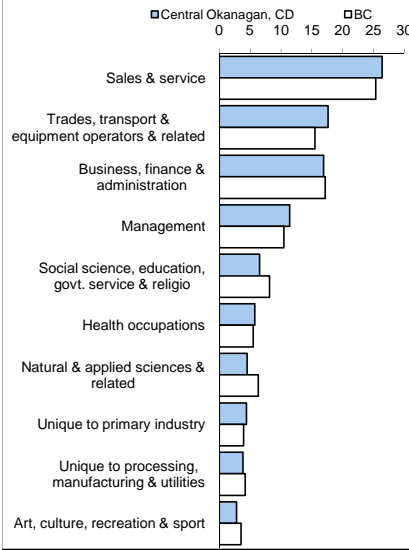

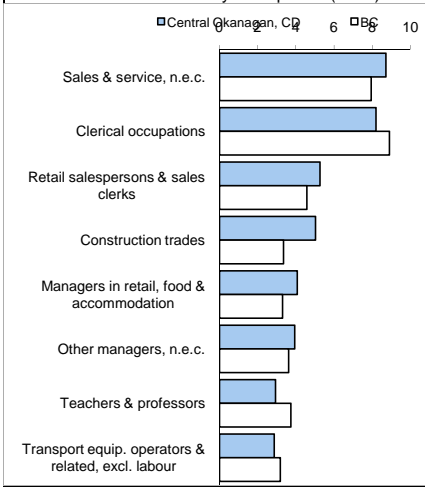
Percent Distribution by Occupation (NOC)

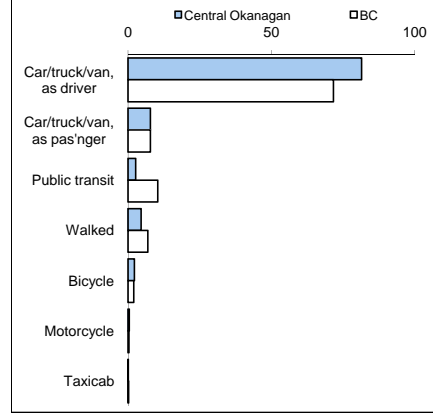
Percent Distribution by Occupation (NOC)

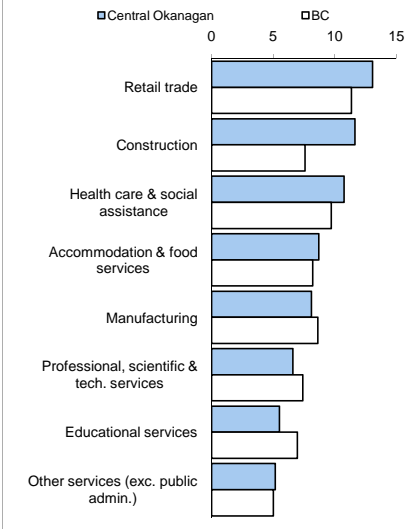

Based on population with usual or no fixed workplace.



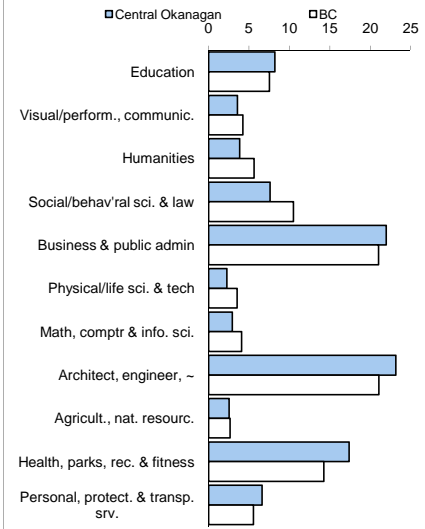
### Top 8 Industries by Labour Force

Percent Distribution by Industry (NAICS 2002)



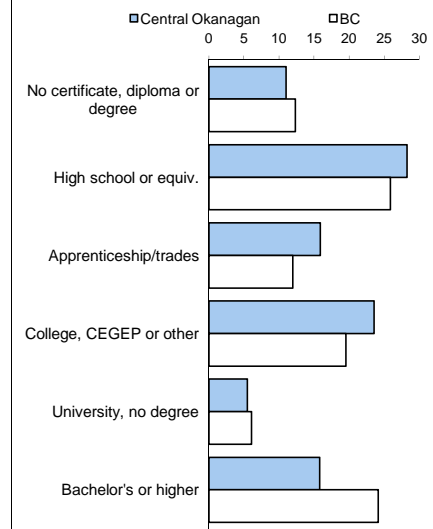
### Education: Field of Study

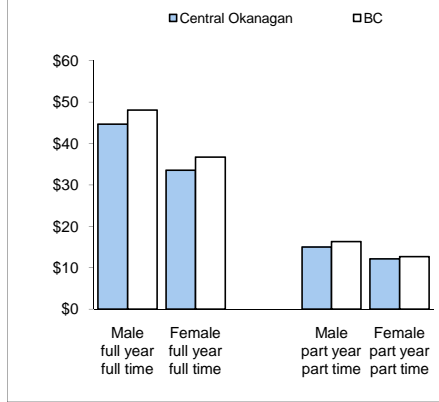

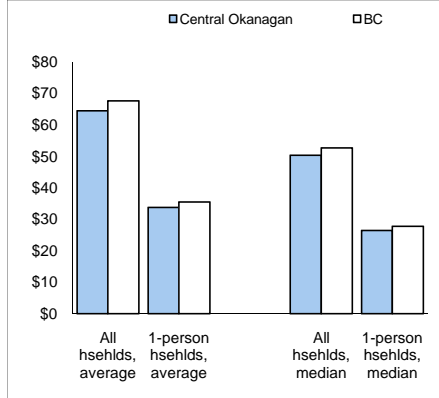

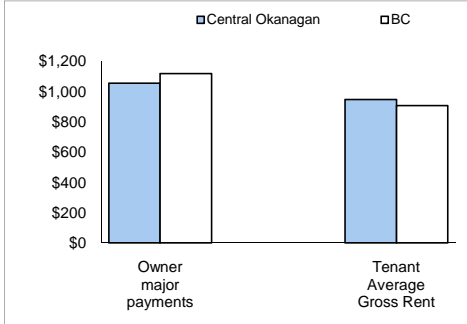
**2005 Before-tax Household Income (\$,000)**
