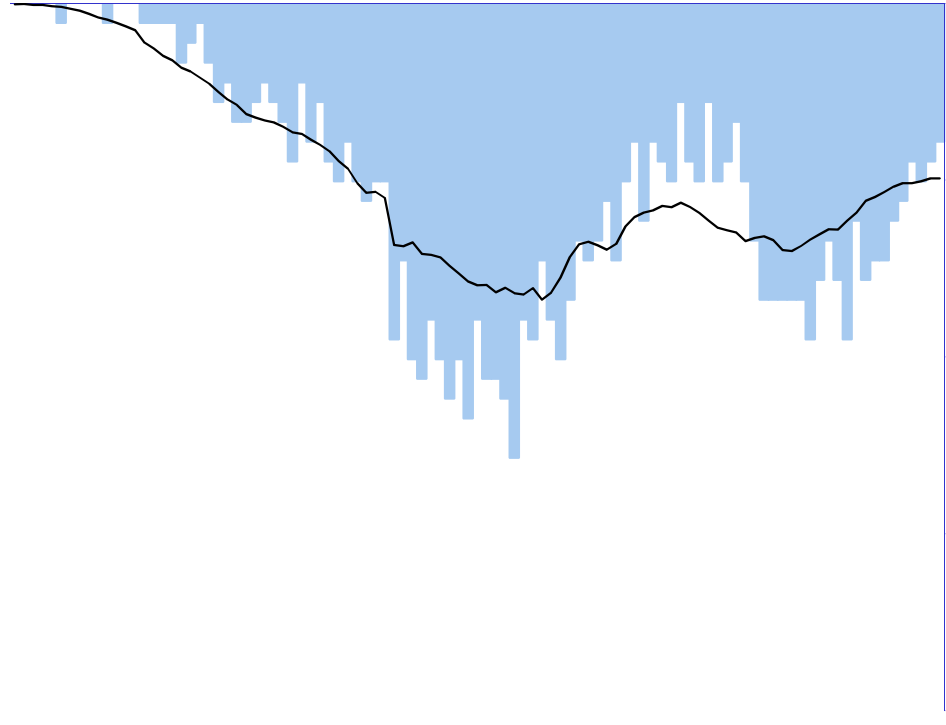

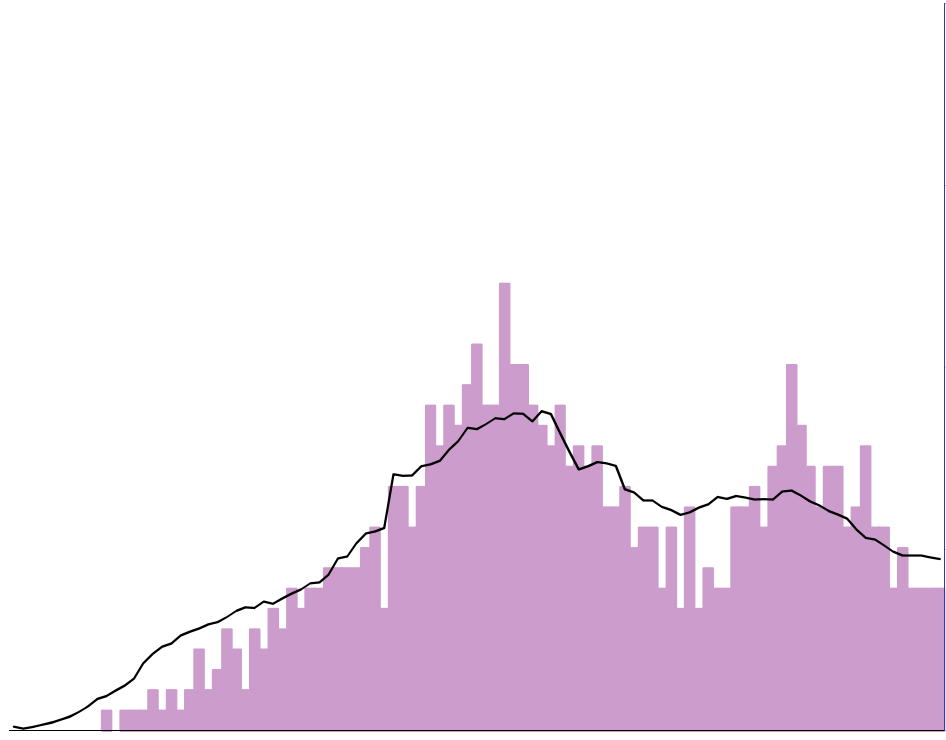

% Distribution of Visible Minority (vis. min.)



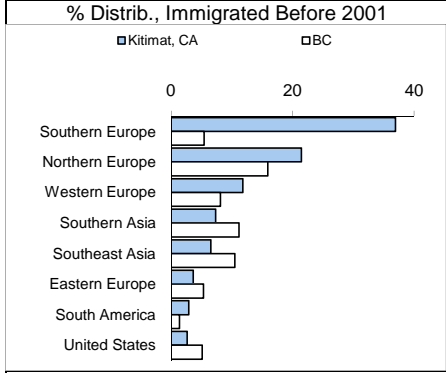

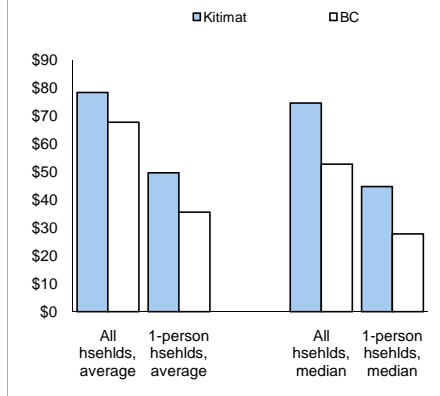

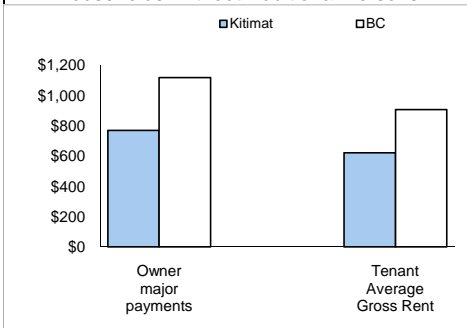
2005 Before-tax Household Income (\$,000)
