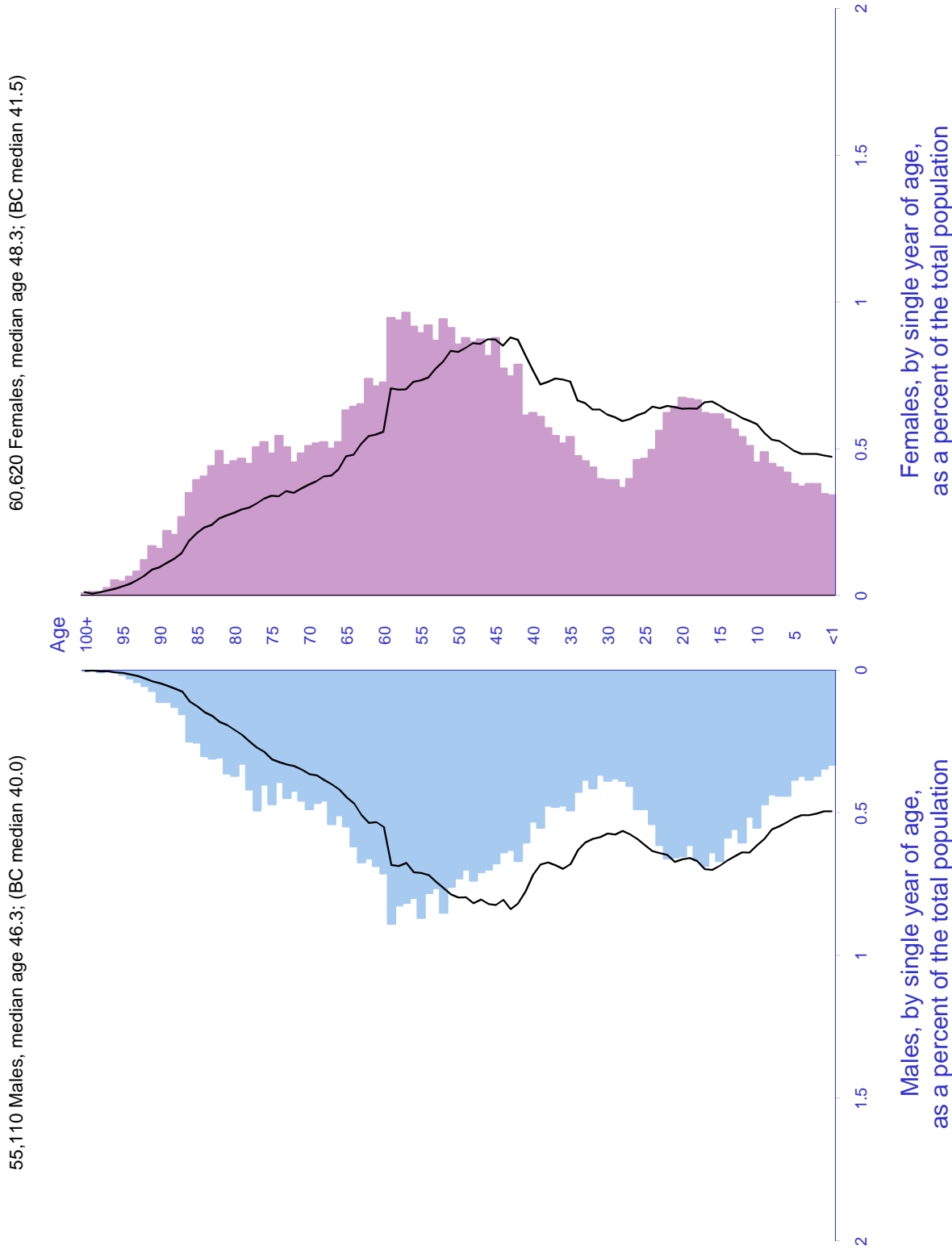

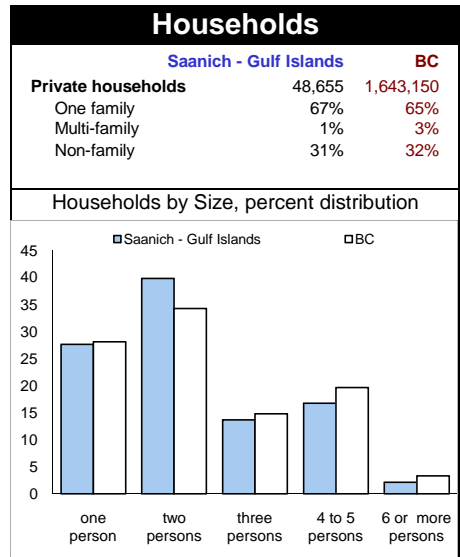
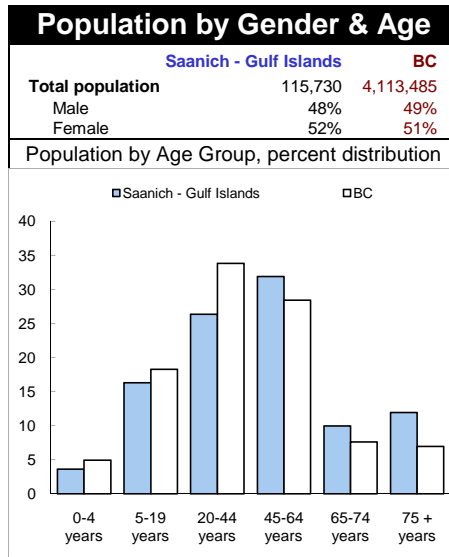
Age pyramid of Saanich - Gulf Islands, FED compared to British Columbia (line)

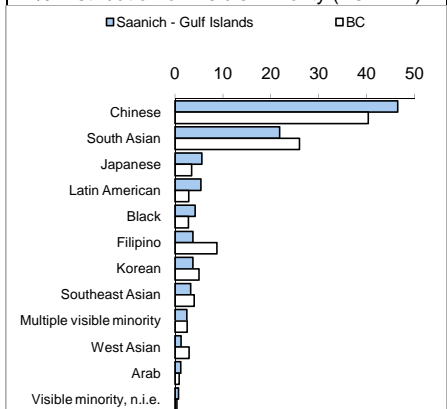

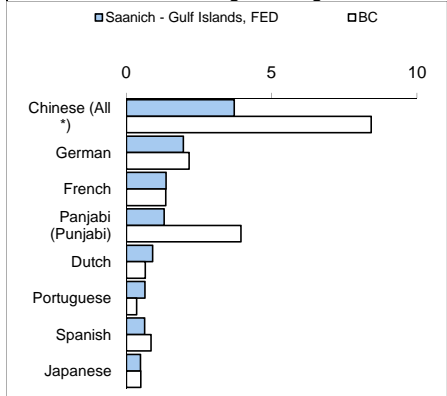

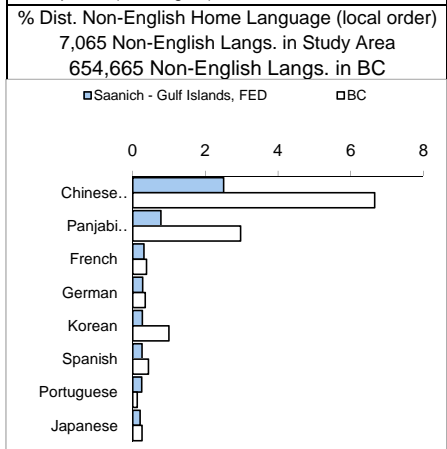

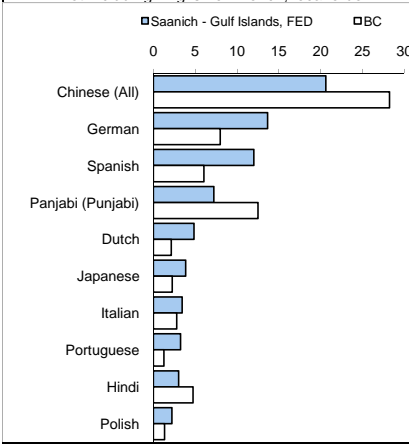

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Non-Official Languages Spoken

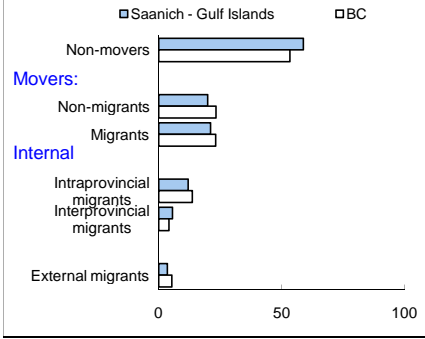

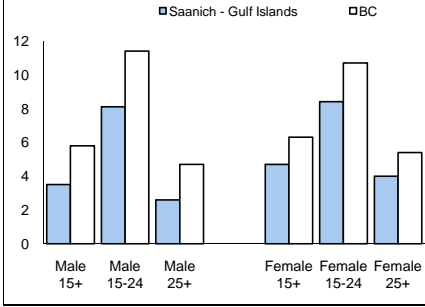
5-Year Mobility of Population 5 Years & Older, % distrib.

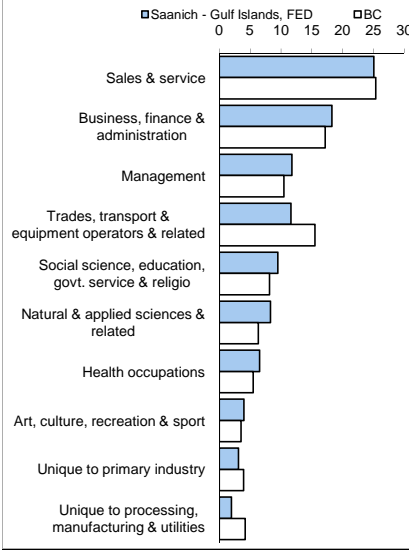

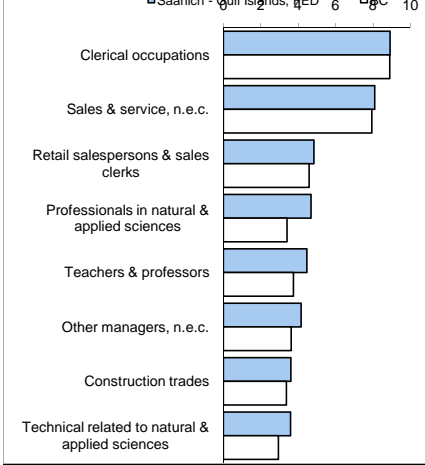
Percent Distribution by Occupation (NOC)

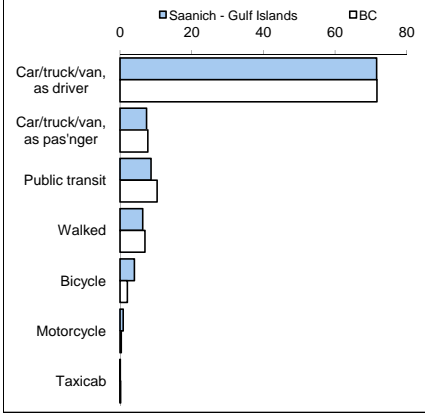

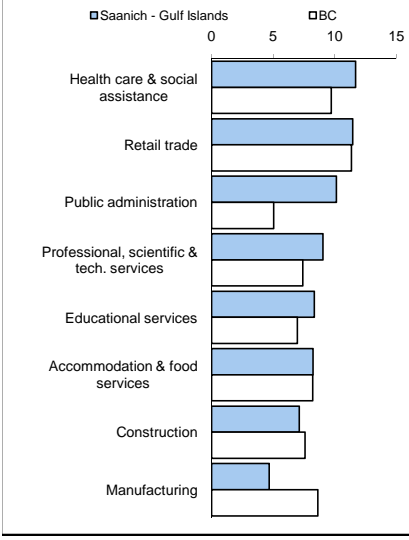

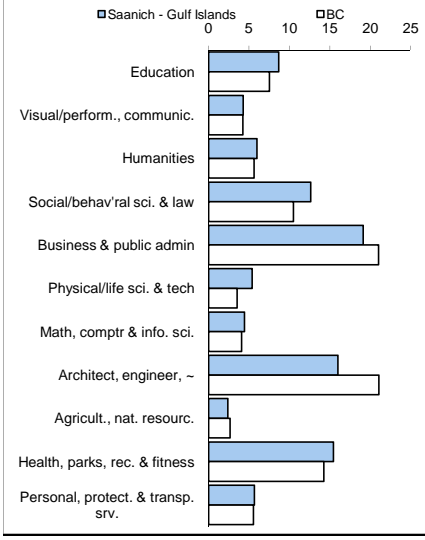
Top 8 Industries by Labour Force

Percent Distribution by Industry (NAICS 2002)



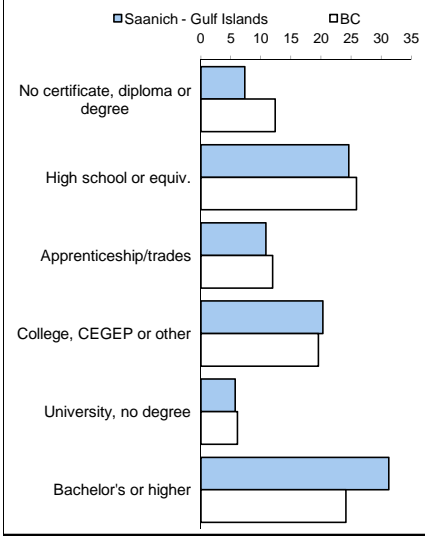
Education: Field of Study

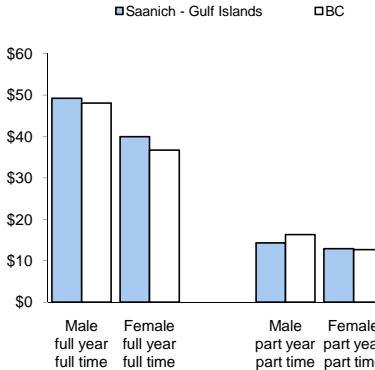

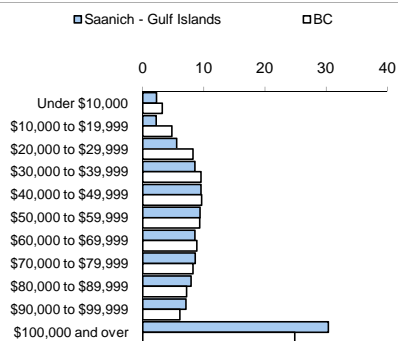

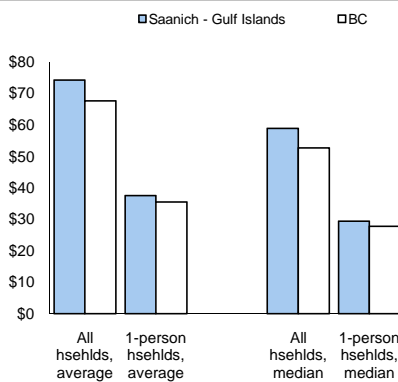

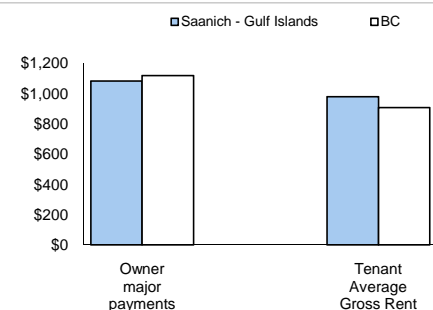
2005 Before-tax Household Income (\$,000)
