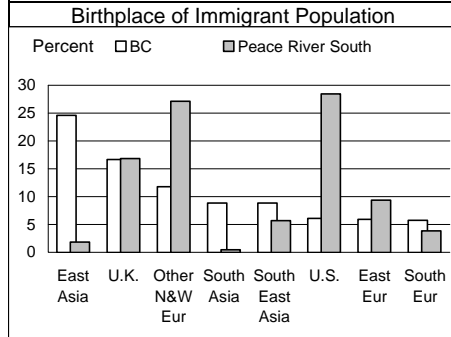

This report is derived by summing data for Federal Electoral District enumeration areas (FED EAs) that constitute the Provincial Electoral District (PED). EAs crossing PED boundaries are allocated to only one PED. Since data for a number of FED EAs is suppressed and data for all others is randomly rounded to preserve privacy of individuals, the sum of data for all PEDs will not total to BC figures here that have been rounded after first aggregating unsuppressed and unrounded FED EA data.
