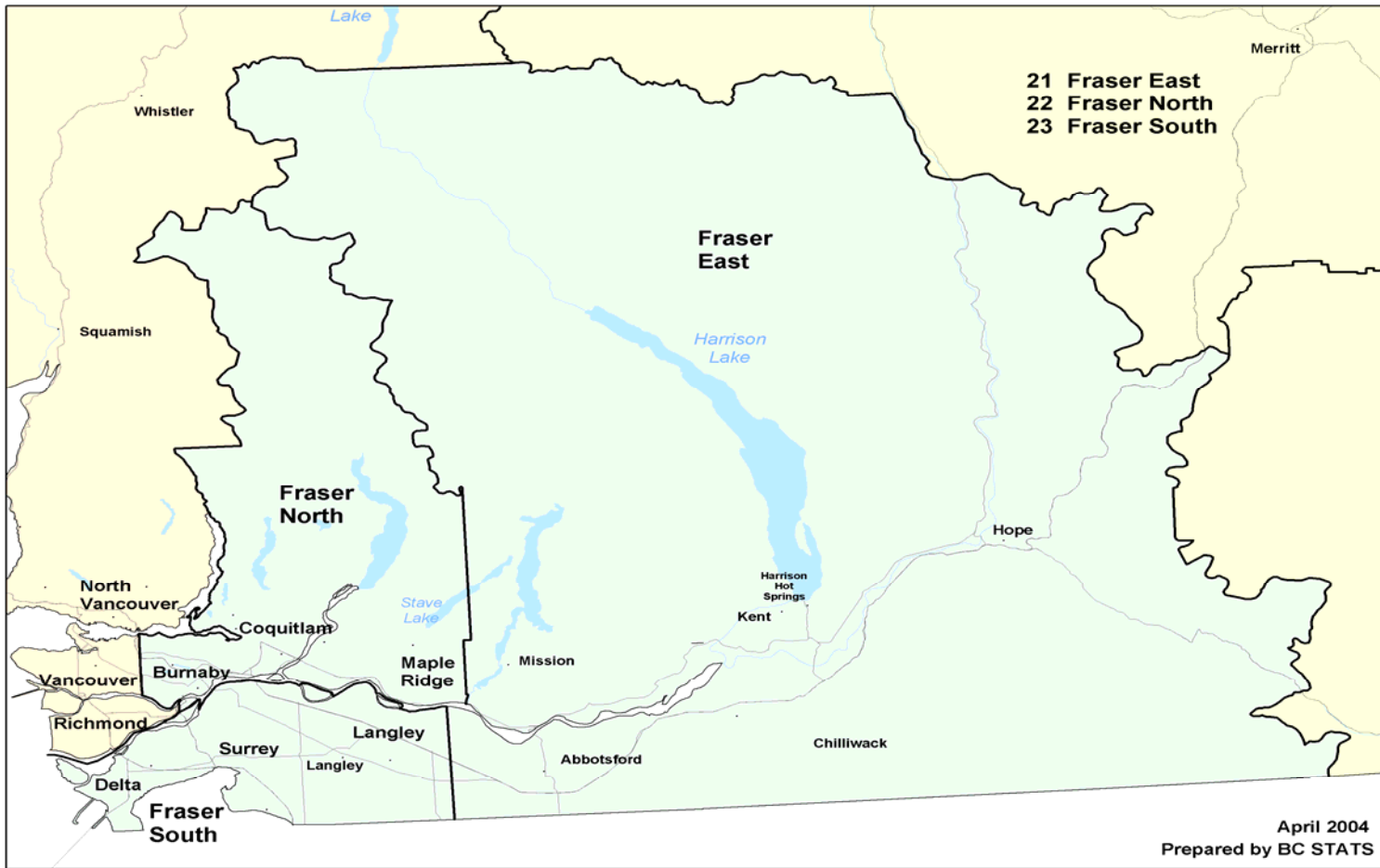

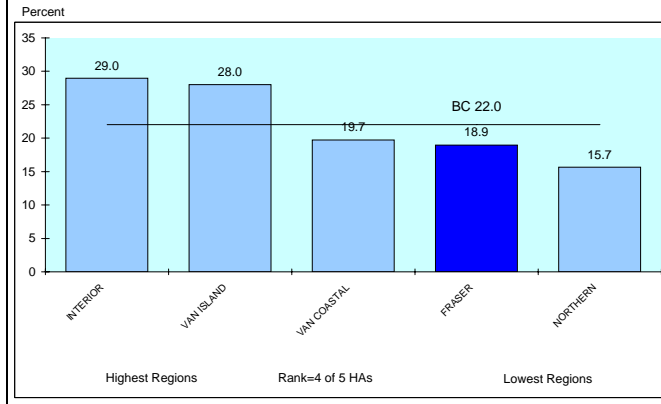

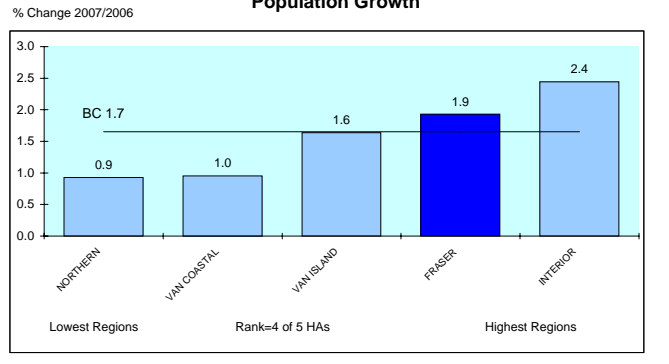
**Elderly Dependency Rate - 2008**

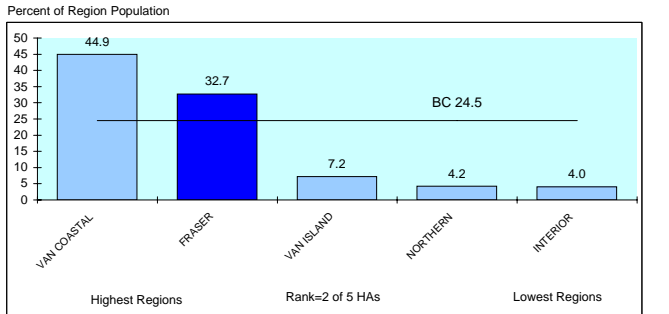

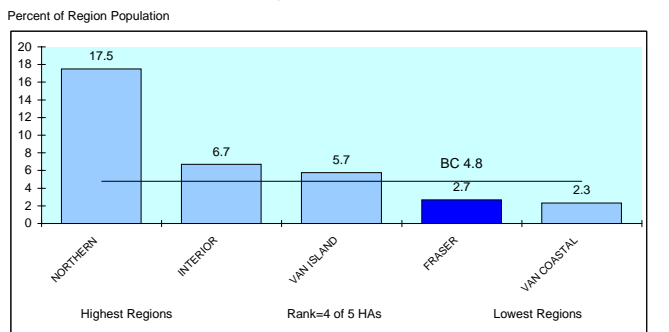

**Visible Minority Population - 2006**



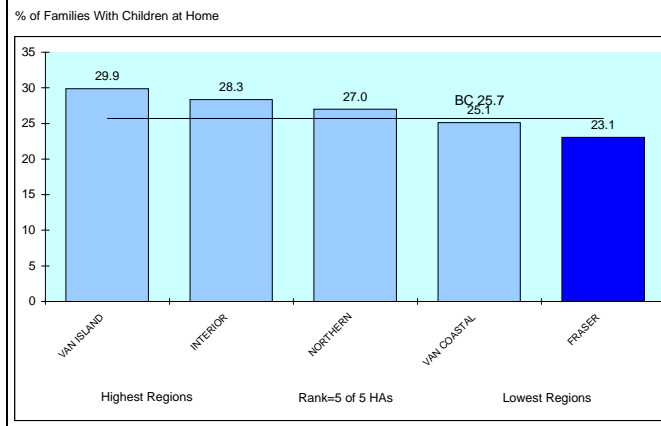
**Aboriginal Identity - 2006**

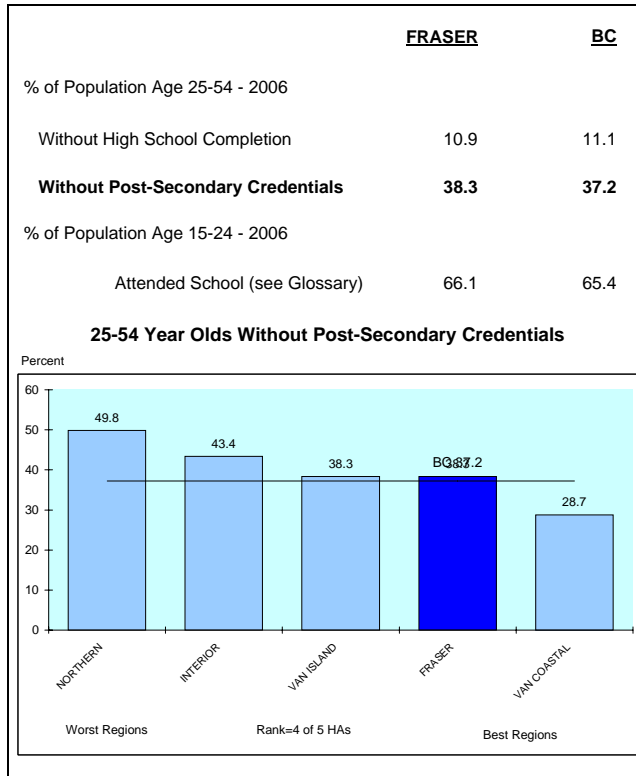

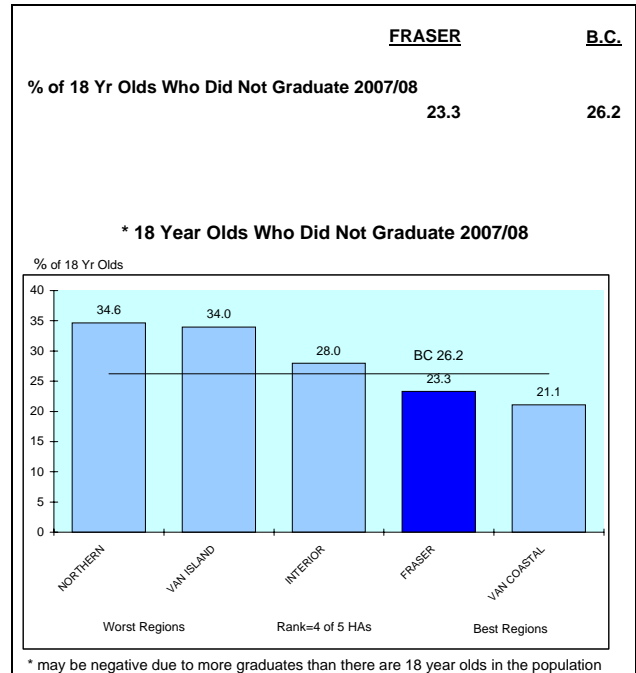

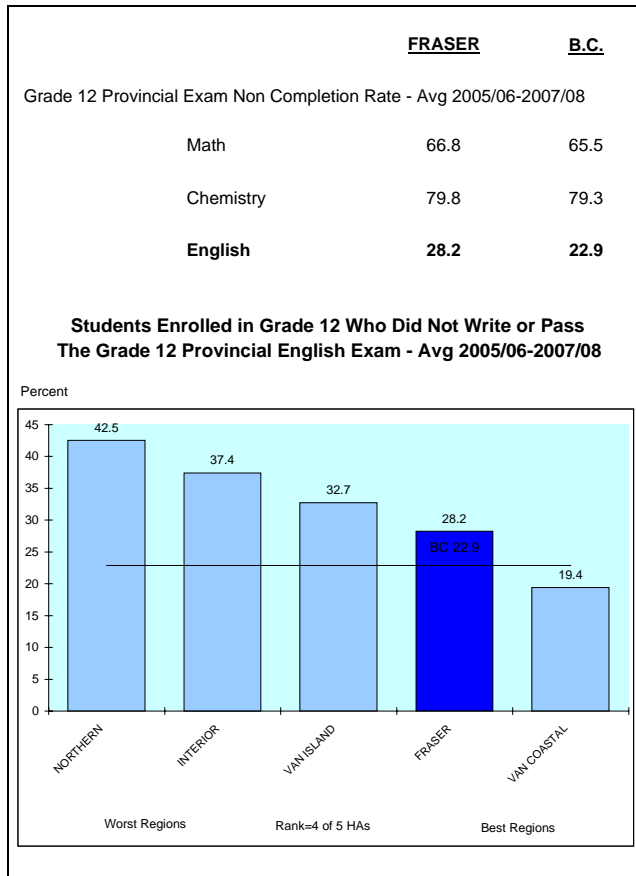

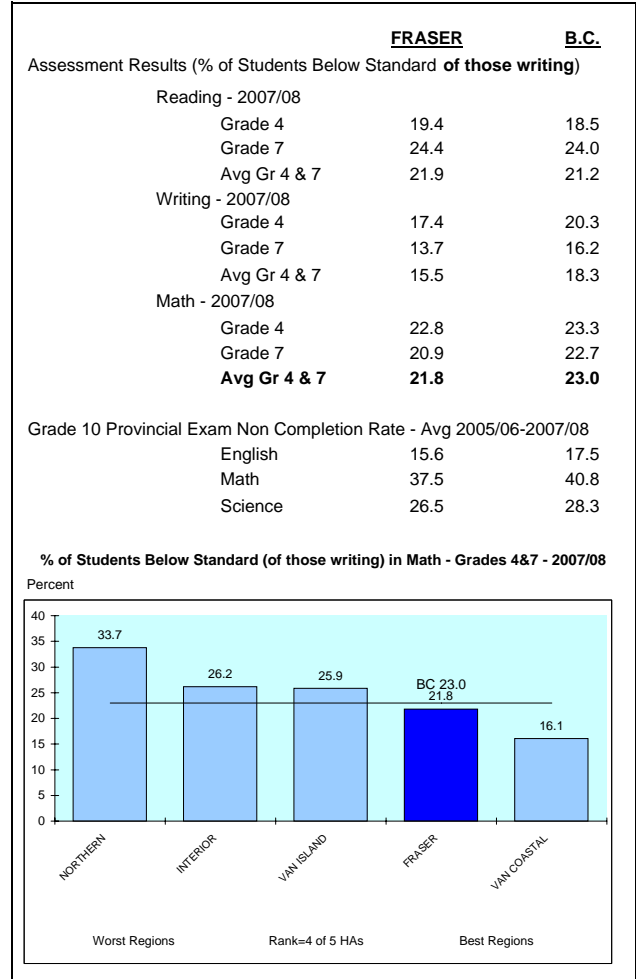

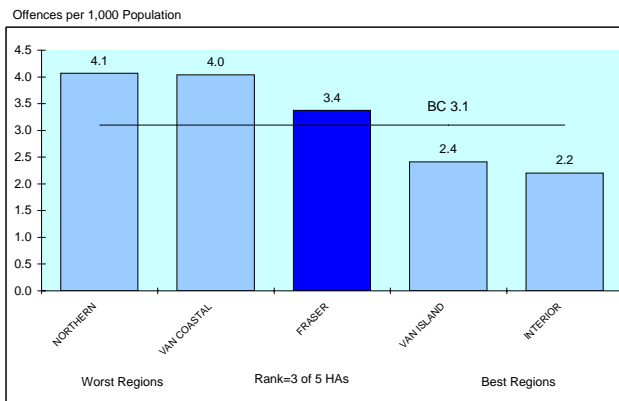

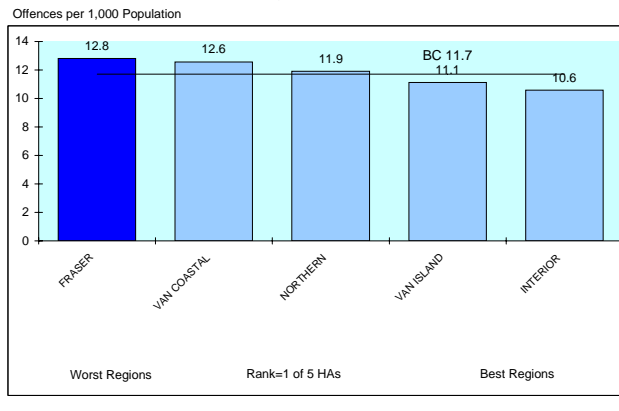

Serious Property Crime Rate - 2004-2006



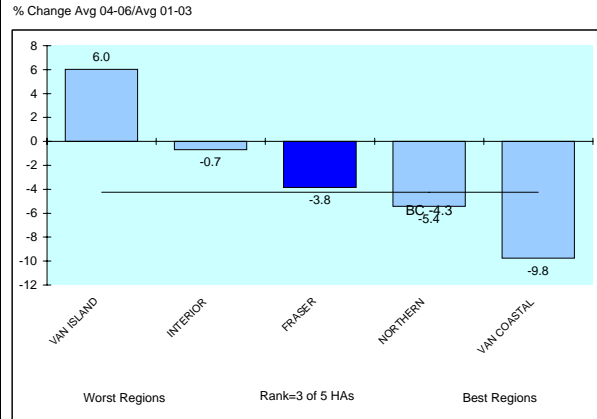

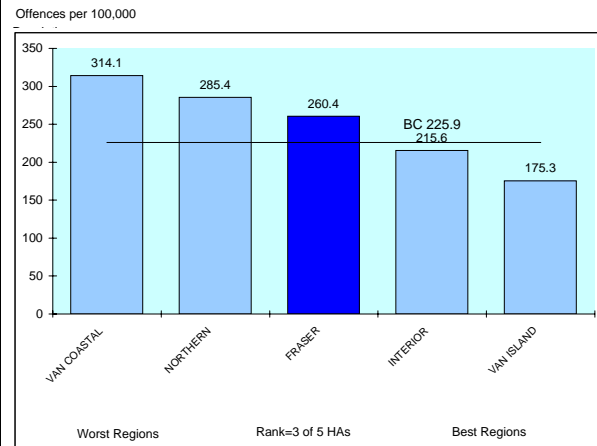
Change in Total Serious Crime Rate

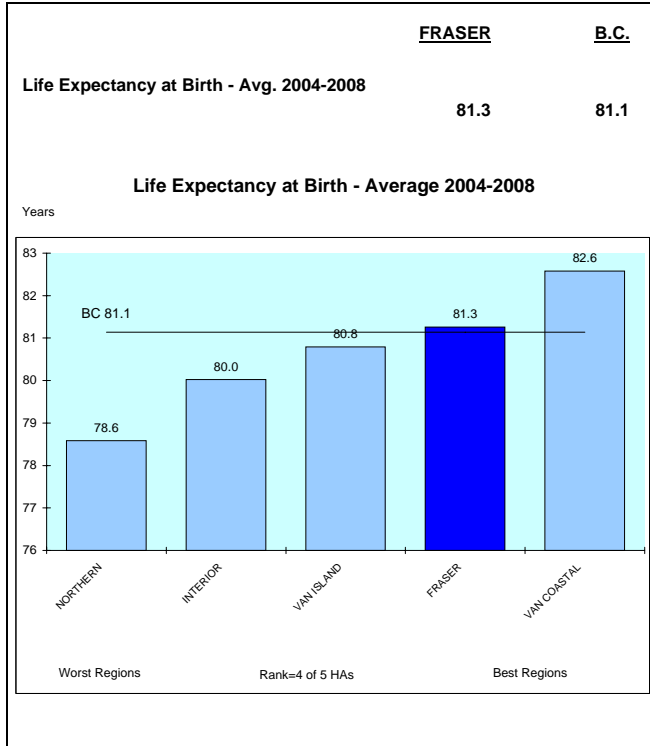
Non-Cannabis Drug Offences - Avg 2004-2006



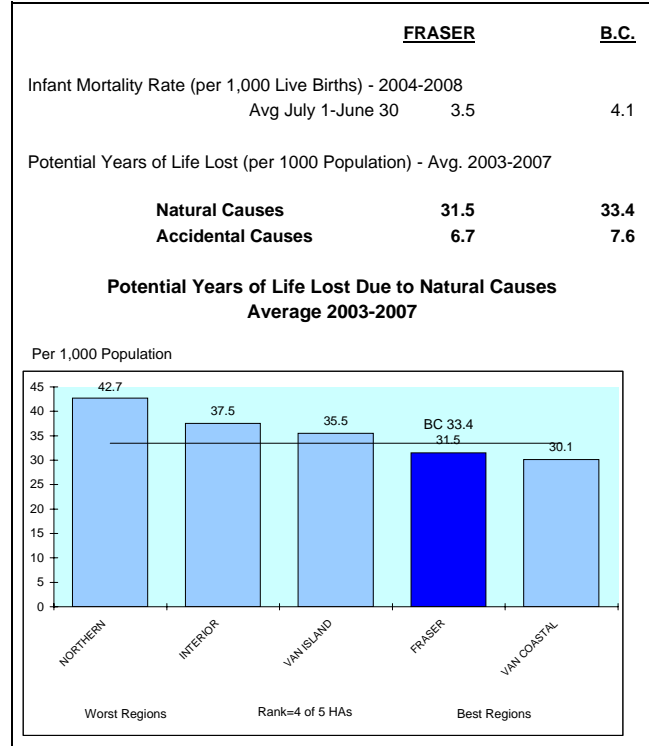

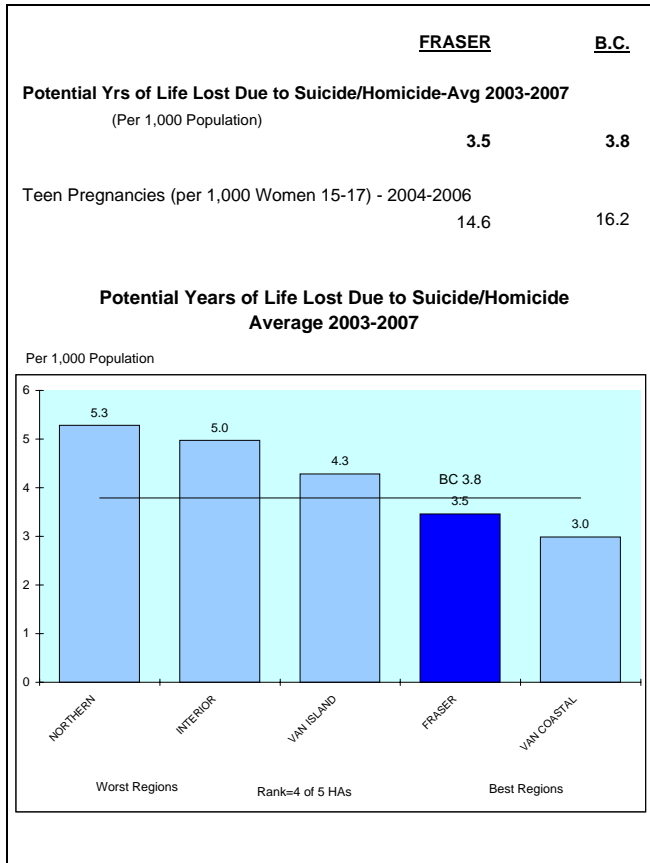

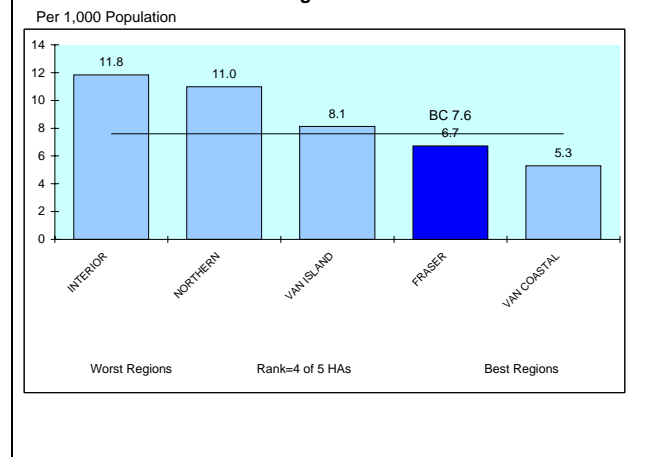

Potential Years of Life Lost Due to Accidental Causes Average 2003-2007



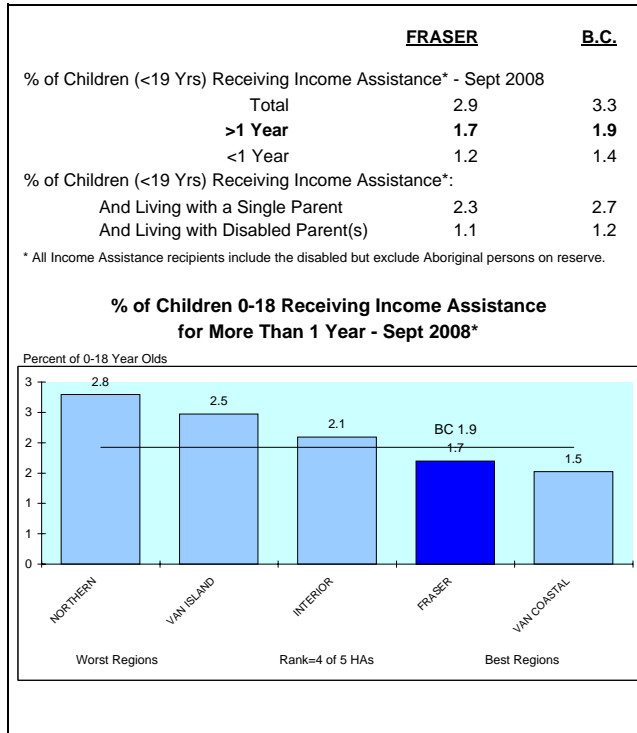

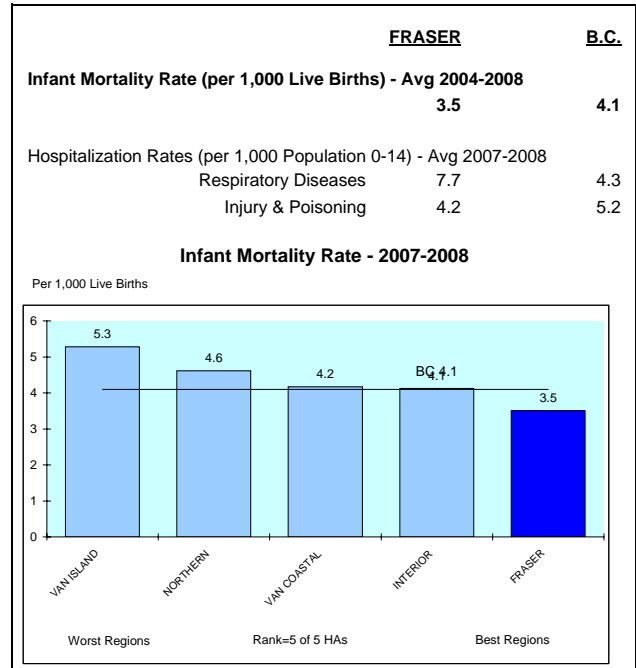

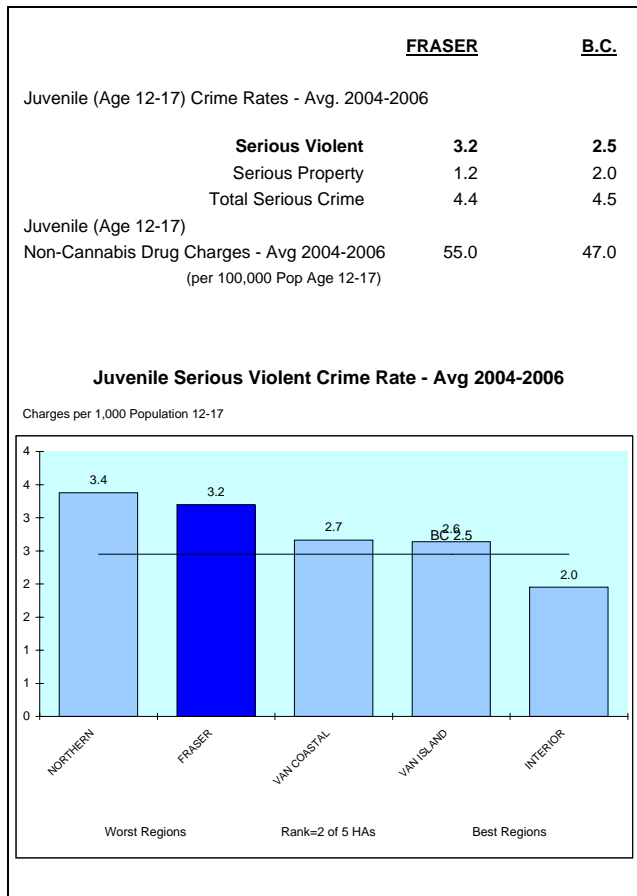

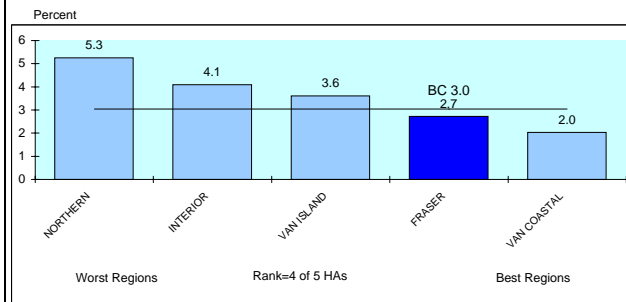

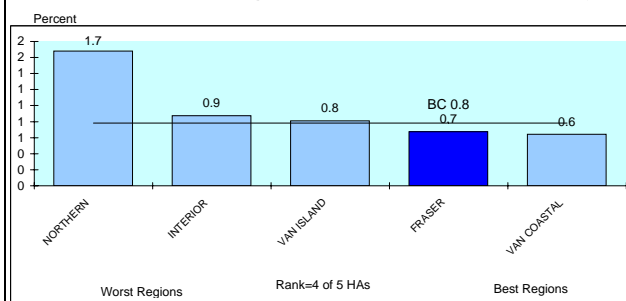

**% of Youth 19-24 Receiving Income Assistance Who Are Employable**

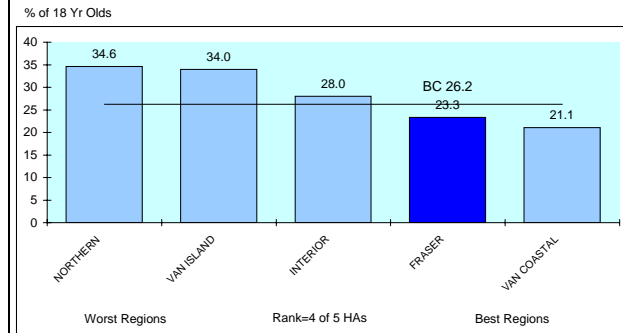

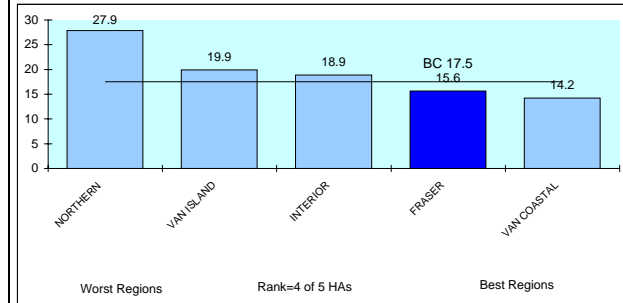

**18 Year Olds Who Did Not Graduate - 2007/08**



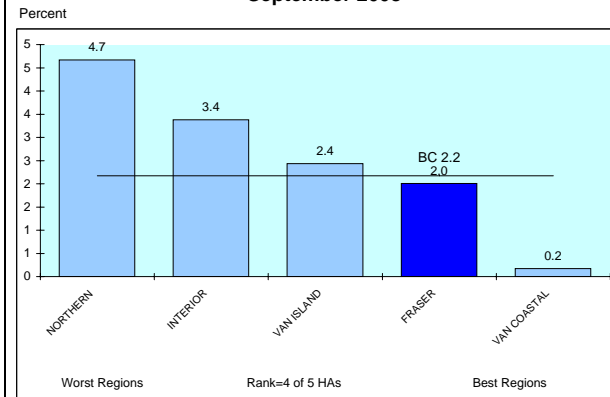
**Gr. 10 Prov. Exam Non-Completion Rate - English - Avg 2005/06-2007/08**
