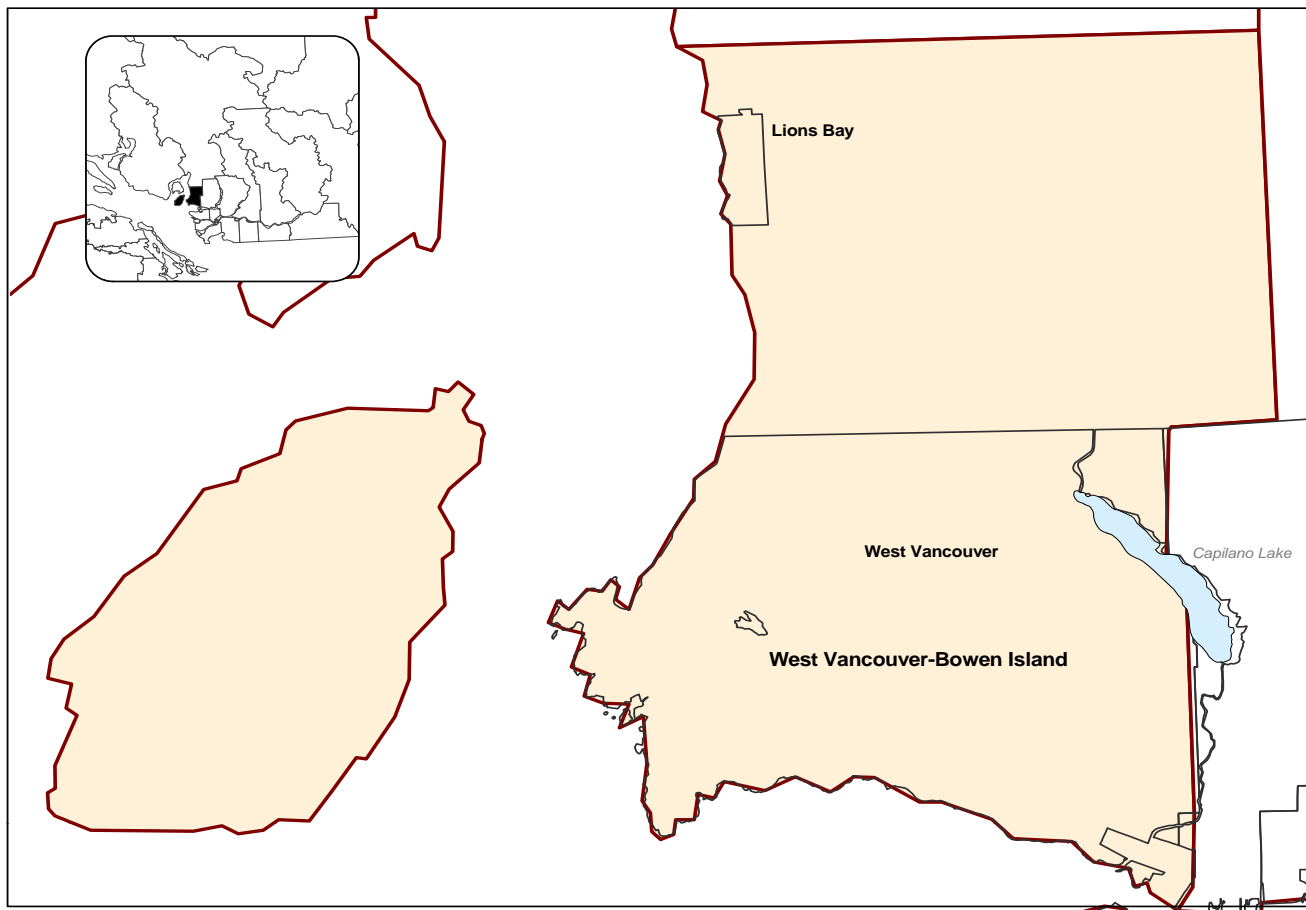

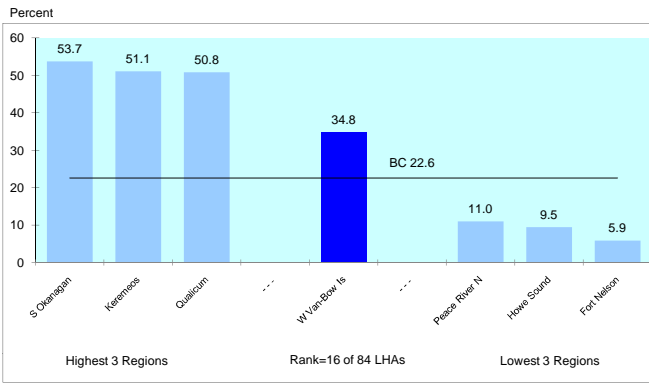

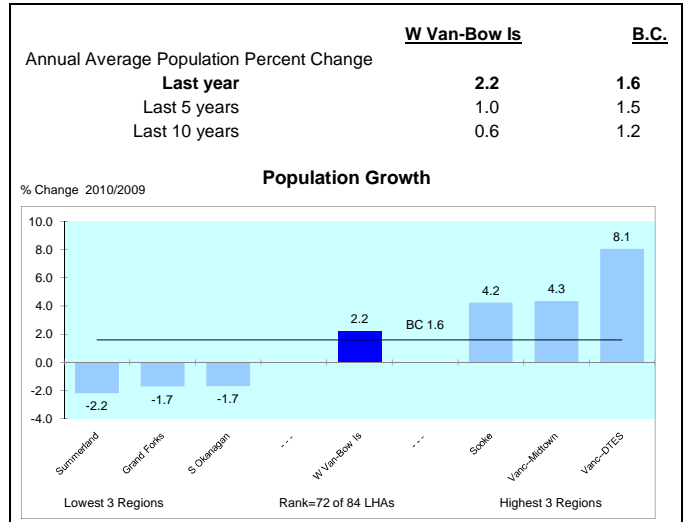

Elderly Dependency Rate - 2010



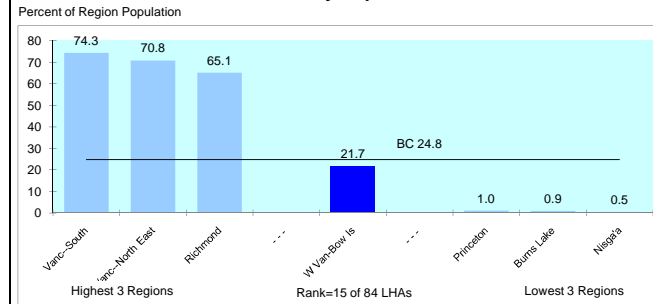

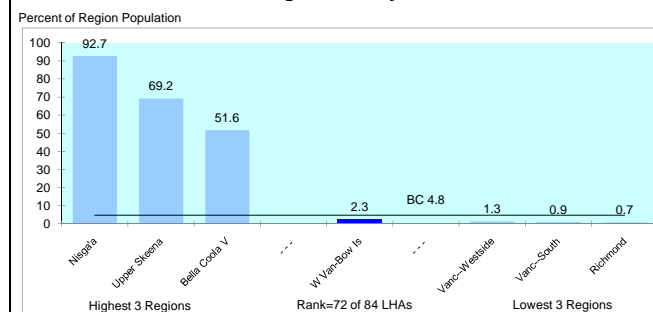

Visible Minority Population - 2006



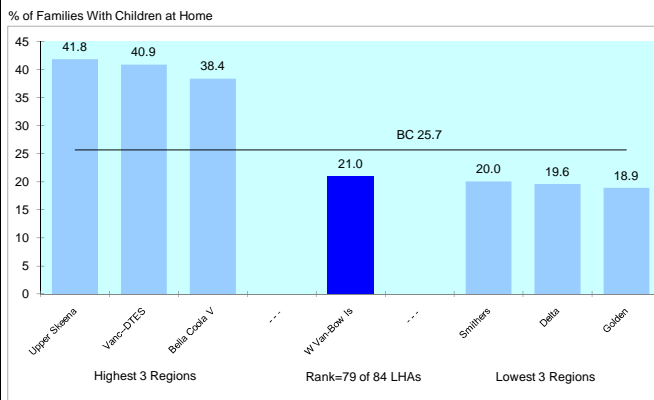
Aboriginal Identity - 2006

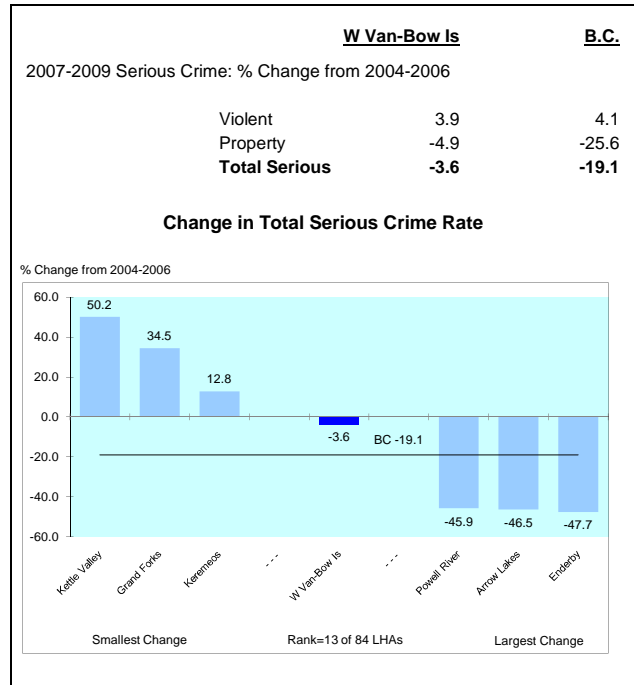

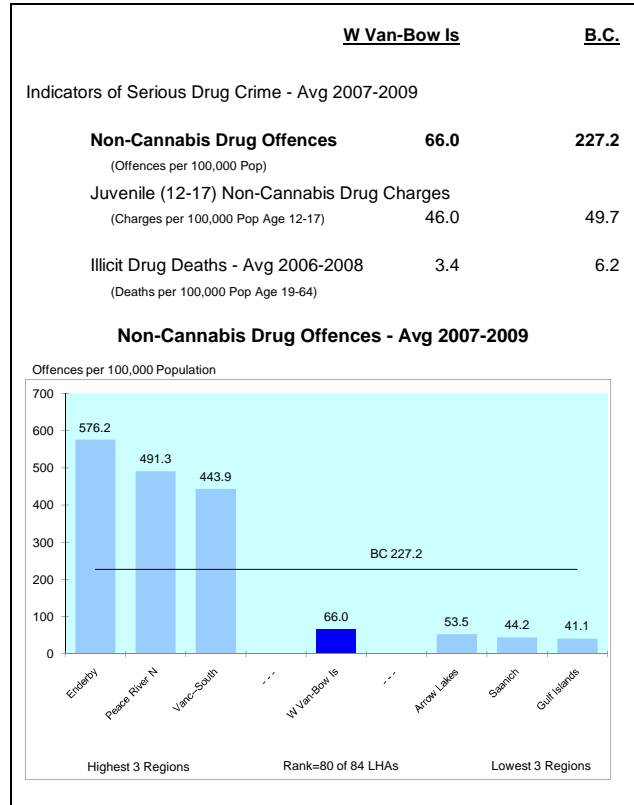

CHANGE IN CRIME RATE



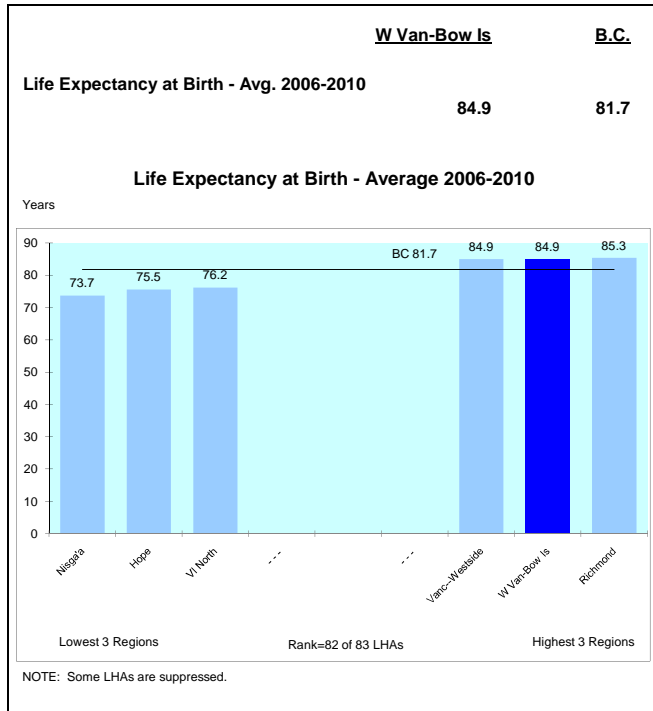

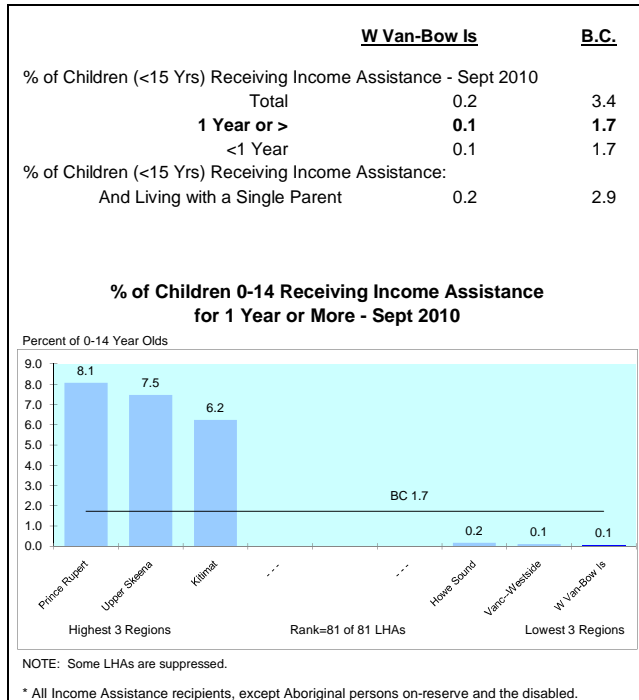

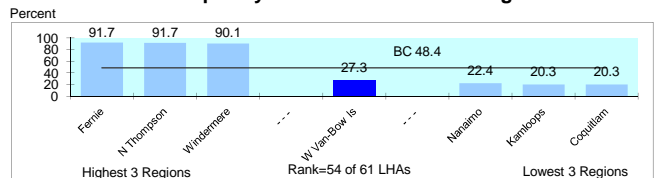

Percent of Temporary Residents that are Foreign Workers



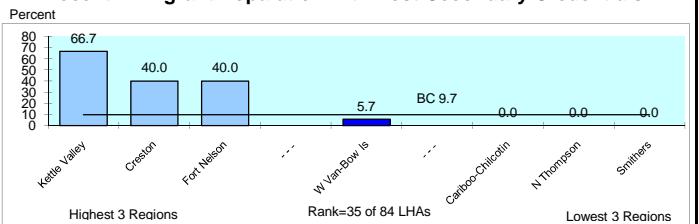

Unemployment Rate 2006 Recent Immigrant Population with Post-Secondary Credentials

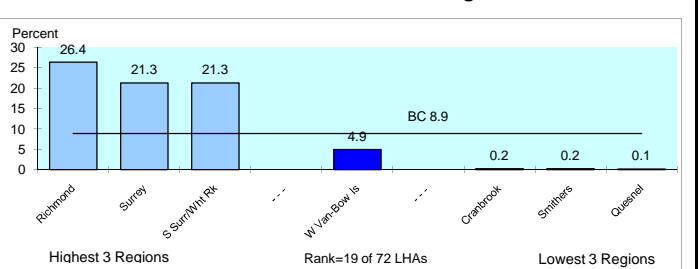
