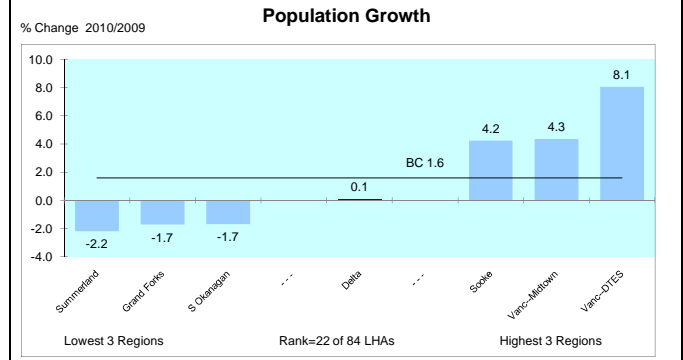

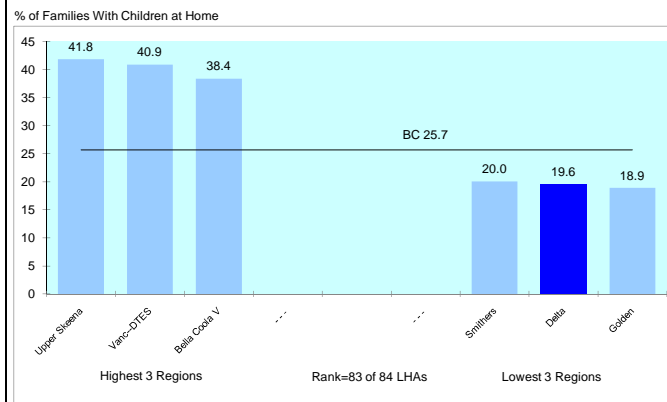
### Visible Minority Population - 2006



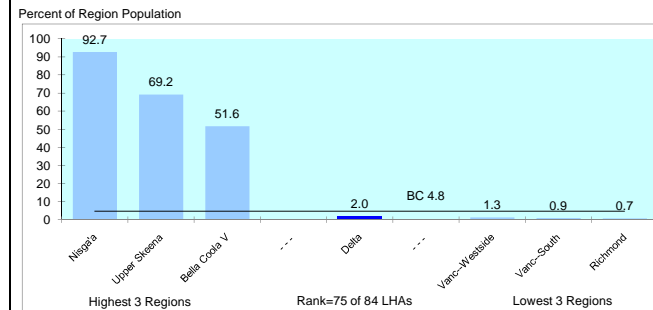

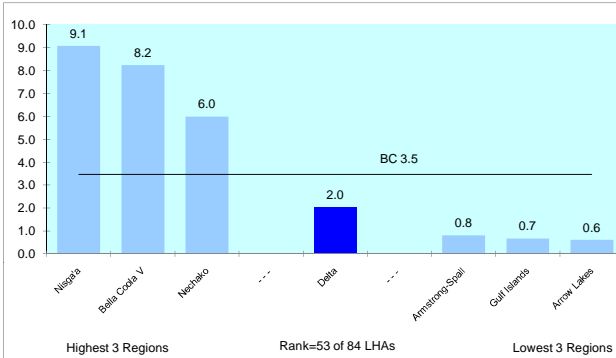

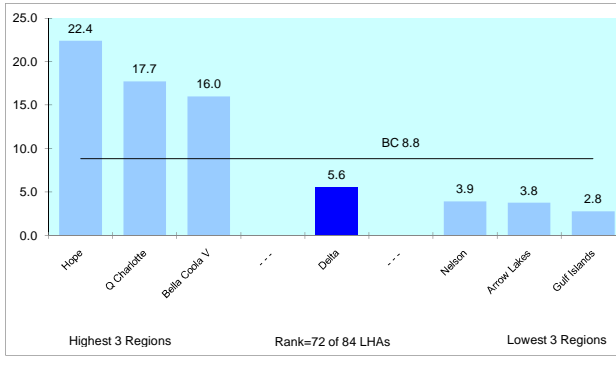
Serious Violent Crime Rate - 2007-2009

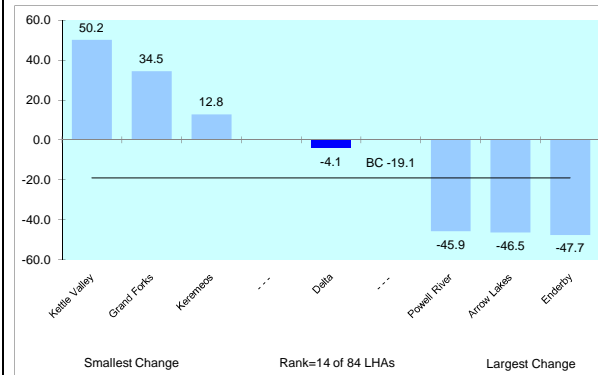

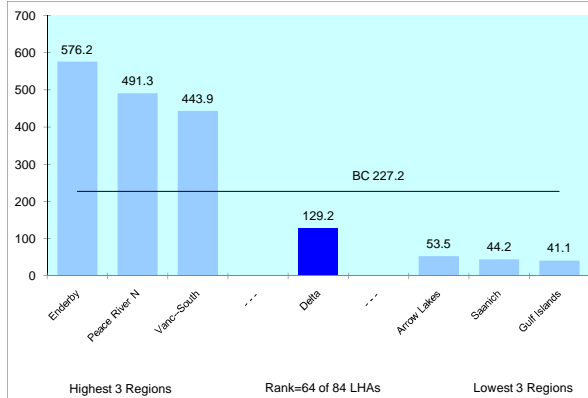

Offences per 100,000 Population



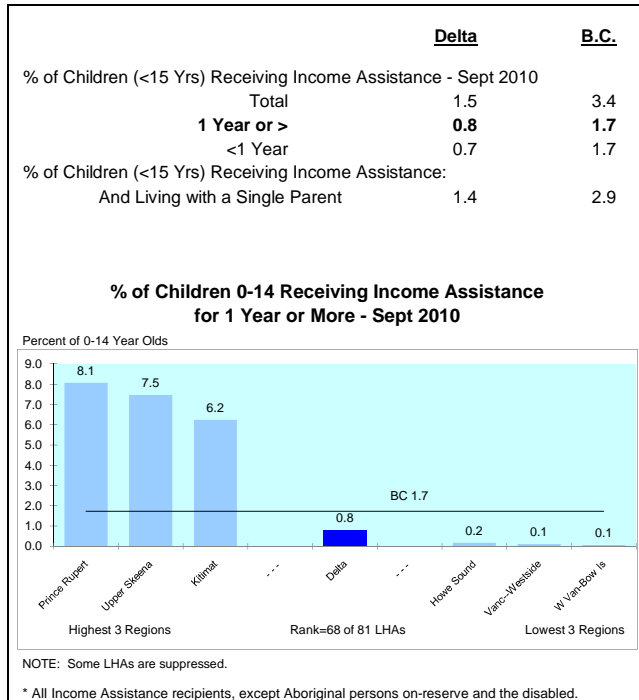

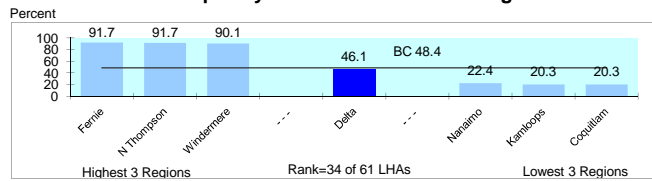

**Percent of Temporary Residents that are Foreign Workers**



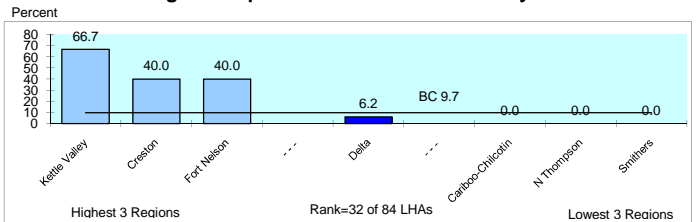

Recent Immigrant Population with Post-Secondary Credentials**

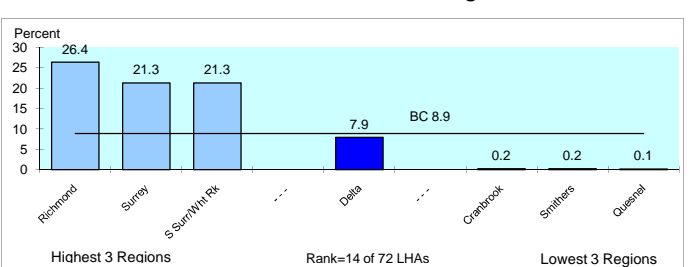
